**4. Title:** Alcoholic beverage control; new license for certain commercial lifestyle centers.

**5. Summary:** Defines "commercial lifestyle center" and creates a new nonretail license for commercial lifestyle centers. The bill sets out the privileges of the license and imposes a \$300 annual state tax and a \$60 annual local tax on the license. The bill contains technical amendments.

**6. Budget Amendment Necessary:** No

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** Indeterminate (see Item #8)

**8. Fiscal Implications:** The proposed bill defines "commercial lifestyle center" and establishes licensing fees for this new license classification. The bill clarifies that only alcoholic beverages acquired from retailers at a "commercial lifestyle center" may be consumed at those premises.

According to the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC), it is uncertain how many establishments would apply for this new license; therefore, the fiscal impact cannot be determined. Any additional costs the agency would incur in relation to this new license type would be defrayed by the imposition and collection of the annual license tax as set out in the bill.
