**2. Patron:** Dunnavant

**3. Committee:** Education and Health

**4. Title:** Board of Pharmacy to deschedule or reschedule cannabidiol upon publication of an interim final rule.

**5. Summary:** Authorizes the Board of Pharmacy (Board) to designate, deschedule, or reschedule as a controlled substance any substance 30 days after publication in the Federal Register of a final or interim final order or rule designating such substance as a controlled substance or descheduling or rescheduling such substance. Under current law, the Board may act 120 days from such publication date.

**7. No Fiscal Impact.**

**8. Fiscal Implications:** This bill as amended would not have a fiscal impact on the Commonwealth. Any costs to the Board of Pharmacy to initiate action to reschedule cannabidiol are minimal and can be absorbed by the agency.

**11. Other Comments:** HB 1799, introduced by Delegate O'Bannon, is a companion bill.
