8. Fiscal Implications: This bill increases the administrative and regulatory responsibilities of the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation (DPOR). The Real Estate Appraiser Board (Board) will need to revise the real estate appraiser regulations in order to conform to the statutory changes in a way that ensures Virginia remains in compliance with federal Appraisal Subcommittee guidelines. The Board will need to conduct at least three additional meetings to complete the regulatory revisions. Board member travel and other related expenses for the additional meetings in FY 2018 will total approximately \$3,230. Forms and applications will also have to be amended by Board to incorporate the changes. These revisions can be completed with current staffing resources. The cost of mailings as required by the Administrative Process Act is expected to be \$100 or less in FY 2018.
