3. Committee: Commerce and Labor

4. Title: Direct primary care agreements.

5. Summary: Provides that a direct agreement between a patient, the patient's legal representative, or the patient's employer and a health care provider for ongoing primary care services in exchange for the payment of a monthly periodic fee is not health insurance or a health maintenance organization, provided that the health care provider does not require patients to pay monthly periodic fees prior to initiation of the direct agreement coverage period. Provisions of the bill shall not apply to contracts entered into prior to March 1, 2017.
