**3. Committee:** Courts of Justice

**4. Title:** Inpatient psychiatric hospital admission; defendant found incompetent.

**5. Summary:** Removes the prohibition on inpatient psychiatric hospital admission for defendants who have already been ordered to receive treatment to restore their competency to stand trial.

**6. Budget Amendment Necessary:** No.

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** No fiscal impact.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** This bill does not have a fiscal impact. While this bill will expedite the process of admission to a state mental health facility, it is not anticipated that it will increase the number of individuals hospitalized, nor increase the total number of bed days. Because this legislation does not narrow or broaden the admission criteria, it is estimated that anyone admitted as a result of this bill would have been admitted anyway.
