That § 22.1-299.6 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 11 § 22.1-299.6. Career and technical education; three-year licenses. 12 13 A. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the Board shall provide for the issuance of 14 three-year licenses to qualified individuals to teach, either full time or part time, high school career and 15 technical education courses in specific subject areas for no more than 50 percent of the instructional day or year, on average. 16 B. The Board shall issue a three-year license to teach high school career and technical education 17 courses in a specific subject area to an individual who: 18 19 1. Submits an application to the Board, in the form prescribed by the Board, that includes a 20 recommendation for such a license from the local school board; 21 2. Meets certain basic conditions for licensure as prescribed by the Board; 22 3. Meets one of the following requirements: (i) holds, at a minimum, a baccalaureate degree from a 23 regionally accredited institution of higher education and has completed coursework in the career and 24 technical education subject area in which the individual seeks to teach, (ii) holds the required 25 professional license in the specific career and technical education subject area in which the individual seeks to teach, where applicable, or (iii) holds an industry certification credential, as that term is defined 26 27 in § 22.1-298.1, in the specific career and technical education subject area in which the individual seeks 28 to teach, or (iv) has at least two years of experience as a teaching assistant in the school division in the 29 specific career and technical education subject area in which the individual seeks to teach; 30 4. Has at least four years of full-time work experience or its equivalent in the specific career and 31 technical education subject area in which the individual seeks to teach; and 32 5. Has obtained qualifying scores on the communication and literacy professional teacher's assessment prescribed by the Board. 33 34 C. The employing school board shall assign a mentor to supervise an individual issued a three-year 35 license pursuant to this section during his first year two years of teaching. 36 D. Except as otherwise provided in subsection E, any individual issued a three-year license pursuant 37 to this section may be granted subsequent three-year extensions of such license by the Board upon recommendation of the local school board. 38 39 E. Any individual issued a three-year license pursuant to this section who completes (i) nine semester 40 hours of specialized professional studies credit from a regionally accredited institution of higher education or (ii) an alternative course of professional studies proposed by the local school board and 41 approved by the Department of Education shall be granted a three-year extension of such license by the 42 Board and may be granted subsequent three-year extensions of such license by the Board upon 43 recommendation of the local school board. Any such specialized professional studies credit or alternative 44 course of professional studies may be completed through distance learning programs and shall include 45 human growth and development; curriculum, instructional, and technology procedures; and classroom 46 47 and behavior management. F. No three-year license issued by the Board pursuant to this section shall be deemed a provisional 48 49 license or a renewable license, as those terms are defined in § 22.1-298.1. G. Individuals issued a three-year license pursuant to this section shall not be eligible for continuing 50 51 contract status while teaching under such license and shall be subject to the probationary terms of 52 employment specified in § 22.1-303. 53 H. The provisions of this article and of Board regulations governing the denial, suspension, cancellation, revocation, and reinstatement of licensure shall apply to three-year licenses issued pursuant 54 55 to this section. I. The Board shall report at least triennially to the Chairmen of the House Committee on Education 56 57 and the Senate Committee on Education and Health on the issuance of three-year licenses pursuant to 58 this section by high school, local school division, and career and technical education subject area.

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
