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9	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
10	1. That § 54.1-3500 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
11	§ 54.1-3500. Definitions.
12	As used in this chapter, unless the context requires a different meaning:
13	"Appraisal activities" means the exercise of professional judgment based on observations and
14	objective assessments of a client's behavior to evaluate current functioning, diagnose, and select
15	appropriate treatment required to remediate identified problems or to make appropriate referrals.
16	"Board" means the Board of Counseling.
17	"Certified substance abuse counseling assistant" means a person certified by the Board to practice in
18 19	accordance with the provisions of § 54.1-3507.2.
19 20	"Certified substance abuse counselor" means a person certified by the Board to practice in accordance with the provisions of § 54.1-3507.1.
<b>2</b> 0 <b>2</b> 1	"Counseling" means the application of principles, standards, and methods of the counseling
22	profession in (i) conducting assessments and diagnoses for the purpose of establishing treatment goals
23	and objectives and (ii) planning, implementing, and evaluating treatment plans using treatment
24	interventions to facilitate human development and to identify and remediate mental, emotional, or
25	behavioral disorders and associated distresses that interfere with mental health.
26	"Licensed substance abuse treatment practitioner" means a person who: (i) is trained in and engages
27	in the practice of substance abuse treatment with individuals or groups of individuals suffering from the
28	effects of substance abuse or dependence, and in the prevention of substance abuse or dependence; and
29	(ii) is licensed to provide advanced substance abuse treatment and independent, direct, and unsupervised
30 21	treatment to such individuals or groups of individuals, and to plan, evaluate, supervise, and direct
31 32	substance abuse treatment provided by others.
32 33	"Marriage and family therapist" means a person trained in the assessment appraisal and treatment of cognitive, affective, or behavioral mental and emotional disorders within the context of marriage and
33 34	family systems through the application of therapeutic and family systems theories and techniques.
35	"Marriage and family therapy" means the assessment appraisal and treatment of cognitive, affective,
36	or behavioral mental and emotional disorders within the context of marriage and family systems through
37	the application of therapeutic and family systems theories and techniques and delivery of services to
38	individuals, couples, and families, singularly or in groups, for the purpose of treating such disorders.
39	"Practice of counseling" means rendering or offering to render to individuals, groups, organizations,
40	or the general public any service involving the application of principles, standards, and methods of the
41	counseling profession, which shall include appraisal, counseling, and referral activities.
42	"Practice of marriage and family therapy" means the assessmentappraisal and treatment of cognitive,
43	affective, or behavioral mental and emotional disorders within the context of marriage and family
44 45	systems through the application of therapeutic and family systems theories and techniques, which shall include assessment, treatment, and referral activities.
43 46	"Practice of substance abuse treatment" means rendering or offering to render substance abuse
47	treatment to individuals, groups, organizations, or the general public.
48	"Professional counselor" means a person trained in the application of principles, standards, and
49	methods of the counseling profession, including counseling interventions designed to facilitate an
50	individual's achievement of human development goals and remediating mental, emotional, or behavioral
51	disorders and associated distresses that interfere with mental health and development.
52	"Qualified mental health professional" means a person who by education and experience is
53	professionally qualified and registered by the Board to provide collaborative mental health services for
54	adults or children. A qualified mental health professional shall provide such services as an employee or
55	independent contractor of the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services or a
56	provider licensed by the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services.
57 59	"Referral activities" means the evaluation of data to identify problems and to determine advisability
58	of referral to other specialists.

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59 "Registered peer recovery specialist" means a person who by education and experience is 60 professionally qualified and registered by the Board to provide collaborative services to assist individuals 61 in achieving sustained recovery from the effects of addiction or mental illness, or both. A registered peer 62 recovery specialist shall provide such services as an employee or independent contractor of the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services, a provider licensed by the Department of 63 64 Behavioral Health and Developmental Services, a practitioner licensed by or holding a permit issued from the Department of Health Professions, or a facility licensed by the Department of Health. 65

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"Residency" means a post-internship supervised clinical experience registered with the Board. "Resident" means an individual who has submitted a supervisory contract to the Board and has 67 68 received Board approval to provide clinical services in professional counseling under supervision.

"Substance abuse" and "substance dependence" mean a maladaptive pattern of substance use leading to clinically significant impairment or distress. 69 70

"Substance abuse treatment" means (i) the application of specific knowledge, skills, substance abuse 71 treatment theory, and substance abuse treatment techniques to define goals and develop a treatment plan 72 of action regarding substance abuse or dependence prevention, education, or treatment in the substance 73 74 abuse or dependence recovery process and (ii) referrals to medical, social services, psychological, 75 psychiatric, or legal resources when such referrals are indicated.

"Supervision" means the ongoing process, performed by a supervisor, of monitoring the performance 76 77 of the person supervised and providing regular, documented individual or group consultation, guidance, 78 and instruction with respect to the clinical skills and competencies of the person supervised.
