That § 37.2-406 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: § 37.2-406. Conditions for initial licensure of certain providers. 11 12 A. Notwithstanding the Commissioner's discretion to grant licenses pursuant to this article or any 13 Board regulation regarding licensing, no initial license shall be granted by the Commissioner to a provider of treatment for persons with opiate addiction through the use of (i) methadone or (ii) opioid 14 15 replacements other than opioid replacements approved for the treatment of opioid addiction by the U.S. 16 Food and Drug Administration if the provider is to be located within one-half mile of a public or private licensed day care center or a public or private K-12 school, except when such service is provided by a 17 hospital licensed by the Board of Health or the Commissioner or is owned or operated by an agency of 18 19 the Commonwealth. 20 B. No provider shall be required to conduct, maintain, or operate services for the treatment of persons with opiate addiction through the use of (i) methadone or (ii) opioid replacements other than 21 22 opioid replacements approved for the treatment of opioid addiction by the U.S. Food and Drug 23 Administration on Sunday, except when such service is provided by a hospital licensed by the Board of 24 Health or the Commissioner or is owned or operated by an agency of the Commonwealth, subject to 25 regulations or guidelines issued by the Department consistent with the health, safety and welfare of individuals receiving services and the security of take-home doses of (i) methadone or (ii) opioid 26 27 replacements other than opioid replacements approved for the treatment of opioid addiction by the U.S. 28 Food and Drug Administration. 29 C. Upon receiving notice of a proposal for or an application to obtain an initial license from a 30 provider of treatment for persons with opiate addiction through the use of (i) methadone or (ii) opioid 31 replacements other than opioid replacements approved for the treatment of opioid addiction by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, the Commissioner shall, within 15 days of the receipt, notify the local 32 33 governing body of and the community services board serving the jurisdiction in which the facility is to 34 be located of the proposal or application and the facility's proposed location. 35 Within 30 days of the date of the notice, the local governing body and community services board 36 shall submit to the Commissioner comments on the proposal or application. The local governing body 37 shall notify the Commissioner within 30 days of the date of the notice concerning the compliance of the 38 applicant with this section and any applicable local ordinances. 39 D. No license shall be issued by the Commissioner to the provider until the conditions of this section 40 have been met, i.e., local governing body and community services board comments have been received and the local governing body has determined compliance with the provisions of this section and any 41 42 relevant local ordinances. E. No applicant for a license to provide treatment for persons with opiate addiction through the use 43 of (i) methadone or (ii) opioid replacements other than opioid replacements approved for the treatment 44 of opioid addiction by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration that has obtained a certificate of 45 occupancy in accordance with the law and regulations in effect on January 1, 2004, shall be required to 46 comply with the provisions of this section with respect to the existing facility for which the certificate of 47 occupancy was obtained. No existing licensed provider shall be required to comply with the provisions 48 49 of this section with respect to an existing facility in which it is currently providing such treatment. License applicants and licensees who fall within this exception shall, however, be required to comply 50 51 with the provisions of this section for purposes of relocating an existing facility or establishing a new 52 facility. 53 F. The provisions of subsections A and E shall not apply to (i) the jurisdictions in Planning District 8 of to, (ii) an applicant for a license for the purpose of relocating within a city located in Planning 54 District 23 a facility to provide treatment for persons with opiate addiction through the use of methadone or other opioid replacements that has been providing such treatment in the same city since 55 56 1984 and is operated by and located with a community services board, or (iii) an applicant for a license 57 58 to operate in its current location [or to relocate] an existing facility to provide treatment for persons

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with opiate addiction through the use of methadone or other opioid replacements when the facility is 59

located within one-half mile of a public or private licensed day care center or a public or private K-12 school in the City of Richmond, has been licensed and operated as a facility to provide treatment for 60

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persons with opiate addiction through the use of methadone or other opioid replacements by another provider immediately prior to submission of the application for a license, and, upon issuance of the license, will be operated by a behavioral health authority. 63

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
