2 *An Act to amend and reenact §§ 54.1-3700 and 54.1-3705 of the Code of Virginia, relating to practice*

6 **Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:**
 7 **1. That §§ 54.1-3700 and 54.1-3705 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows:**
 8 **§ 54.1-3700. Definitions.**

9 As used in this chapter, unless the context requires a different meaning:
 10 "Administration" means the process of attaining the objectives of an organization through a system of
 11 coordinated and cooperative efforts to make social service programs effective instruments for the
 12 amelioration of social conditions and for the solution of social problems.

13 "*Baccalaureate social worker*" means a person who engages in the practice of social work under the
 14 supervision of a master's social worker and provides basic generalist services, including casework
 15 management and supportive services and consultation and education.

16 "Board" means the Board of Social Work.

17 "Casework" means both direct treatment, with an individual or several individuals, and intervention
 18 in the situation on the client's behalf with the objectives of meeting the client's needs, helping the client
 19 deal with the problem with which he is confronted, strengthening the client's capacity to function
 20 productively, lessening his distress, and enhancing his opportunities and capacities for fulfillment.

21 "Casework management and supportive services" means assessment of presenting problems and
 22 perceived needs, referral services, policy interpretation, data gathering, planning, advocacy, and
 23 coordination of services.

24 "Clinical social worker" means a social worker who, by education and experience, is professionally
 25 qualified at the autonomous practice level to provide direct diagnostic, preventive and treatment services
 26 where functioning is threatened or affected by social and psychological stress or health impairment.

27 "Consultation and education" means program consultation in social work to agencies, organizations,
 28 or community groups; academic programs and other training such as staff development activities,
 29 seminars, and workshops using social work principles and theories of social work education.

30 "Group work" means helping people, in the realization of their potential for social functioning,
 31 through group experiences in which the members are involved with common concerns and in which
 32 there is agreement about the group's purpose, function, and structure.

33 "*Master's social worker*" mean a person who engages in the practice of social work and provides
 34 non-clinical, generalist services, including staff supervision and management.

35 "Planning and community organization" means helping organizations and communities analyze social
 36 problems and human needs; planning to assist organizations and communities in organizing for general
 37 community development; and improving social conditions through the application of social planning,
 38 resource development, advocacy, and social policy formulation.

39 "Practice of social work" means rendering or offering to render to individuals, families, groups,
 40 organizations, governmental units, or the general public service which is guided by special knowledge of
 41 social resources, social systems, human capabilities, and the part conscious and unconscious motivation
 42 play in determining behavior. Any person regularly employed by a licensed hospital or nursing home
 43 who offers or renders such services in connection with his employment in accordance with patient care
 44 policies or plans for social services adopted pursuant to applicable regulations when such services do not
 45 include group, marital or family therapy, psychosocial treatment or other measures to modify human
 46 behavior involving child abuse, newborn intensive care, emotional disorders or similar issues, shall not
 47 be deemed to be engaged in the "practice of social work." Subject to the foregoing, the disciplined
 48 application of social work values, principles and methods includes, but is not restricted to, casework
 49 management and supportive services, casework, group work, planning and community organization,
 50 administration, consultation and education, and research.

51 "Research" means the application of systematic procedures for the purpose of developing, modifying,
 52 and expanding knowledge of social work practice which can be communicated and verified.

53 "Social worker" means a person trained to provide service and action to effect changes in human
 54 behavior, emotional responses, and the social conditions by the application of the values, principles,
 55 methods, and procedures of the profession of social work.

56 **§ 54.1-3705. Specific powers and duties of the Board.**

57 In addition to the powers granted in § 54.1-2400, the Board shall have the following specific powers
58 and duties:

59 1. To cooperate with and maintain a close liaison with other professional boards and the community
60 to ensure that regulatory systems stay abreast of community and professional needs.

61 2. To conduct inspections to ensure that licensees conduct their practices in a competent manner and
62 in conformance with the relevant regulations.

63 3. To designate specialties within the profession.

64 4. Expired.

65 5. *To license baccalaureate social workers, master's social workers, and clinical social workers to*
66 *practice consistent with the requirements of the chapter and regulations of the Board.*

67 6. *To register persons proposing to obtain supervised post-degree experience in the practice of social*
68 *work required by the Board for licensure as a clinical social worker.*
