That §§ 10.1-407 through 10.1-418.9 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted and 11 that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 15.2-5704.1 as follows: 12 § 10.1-407. Act of General Assembly required to construct, etc., dam or other structure. 13 14 A. As used in this chapter, "dam or other structure" means any structure extending from bank to 15 bank of a river that will interfere with the normal movement of waterborne traffic, interfere with the 16 normal movement of fish or wildlife, raise the water level on the upstream side of the structure, or lower the water level on the downstream side of the structure. 17 B. After designation of any river or section of river as a scenic river by the General Assembly, no 18 19 dam or other structure impeding the natural flow thereof shall be constructed, operated, or maintained in 20 such river or section of river unless specifically authorized by an act of the General Assembly. 21 C. No new dam or other structure or enlargement of an existing dam or other structure that impedes 22 the natural flow of Goose Creek shall be constructed, operated, or maintained within the section of 23 Goose Creek designated as a scenic river by § 10.1-411 unless specifically authorized by an act of the 24 General Assembly. 25 § 10.1-408. Uses not affected by scenic river designation. 26 A. Except as provided in § 10.1-407, all riparian land and water uses along or in the designated 27 section of a river which that are permitted by law shall not be restricted by this chapter. 28 B. Designation as a scenic river shall not be used: 29 1. To designate the lands along the river and its tributaries as unsuitable for mining pursuant to 30 § 45.1-252 or regulations promulgated with respect to such section, or as unsuitable for use as a location 31 for a surface mineral mine as defined in § 45.1-161.292:2; however, the Department shall still be permitted to exercise the powers granted under § 10.1-402; or 32 33 2. To be a criterion for purposes of imposing water quality standards under the federal Clean Water 34 Act. 35 C. Nothing in this chapter shall preclude the federal government, the Commonwealth, or a locality 36 or local governing body from using, constructing, reconstructing, replacing, repairing, operating, or 37 performing necessary maintenance on any road or bridge. 38 D. Nothing in § 10.1-414 or 10.1-418.6 shall preclude the Commonwealth or a local governing body 39 from constructing, reconstructing, operating, or performing necessary maintenance on any transportation 40 or public water supply project. 41 E. Nothing in this chapter shall preclude the continued: 1. Use, operation, and maintenance of the existing City of Fairfax water impoundment or the 42 installation of new water intake facilities in the existing reservoir located within the section of Goose 43 44 *Creek designated by § 10.1-411;* 45 2. Operation and maintenance of existing dams in the section of the Rappahannock River designated 46 by § 10.1-415; or 47 3. Operation, maintenance, alteration, expansion, or destruction of the Embrey Dam or its appurtenances by the City of Fredericksburg, including the old VEPCO canal and the existing City 48 49 Reservoir behind the Embrey Dam, or any other part of the City's waterworks. 50 F. The City of Richmond shall be allowed to reconstruct, operate, and maintain existing facilities at 51 the Byrd Park and Hollywood Hydroelectric Power Stations at current capacity. Nothing in this chapter 52 shall be construed to prevent the Commonwealth, the City of Richmond, or any common carrier railroad 53 from constructing or reconstructing floodwalls or public common carrier facilities that may traverse the section of the James River designated by § 10.1-412, such as road or railroad bridges, raw water intake 54 55 structures, or water or sewer lines that would be constructed below water level. 56 G. The owner of the Harvell Dam in the City of Petersburg may construct, reconstruct, operate, and

56 G. The owner of the Harvell Dam in the City of Petersburg may construct, reconstruct, operate, and 57 maintain the Harvell Dam subject to other law and regulation.

58 H. Nothing in this chapter shall preclude (i) the continued operation and maintenance of existing

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59 dams in the section of the Rappahannock River designated by § 10.1-415 or (ii) the Commonwealth, the 60 City of Fredericksburg, or the County of Stafford, Spotsylvania, or Culpeper from constructing any new

61 raw water intake structures or devices, including pipes and reservoirs but not dams, or laying water or

62 sewer lines below water level.

63 I. Nothing in this chapter shall:

64 1. Preclude the construction, operation, repair, maintenance, or replacement of (i) a natural gas 65 pipeline for which the State Corporation Commission has issued a certificate of public convenience and necessity or any connections with such pipeline owned by the Richmond Gas Utility and connected to 66 such pipeline or (ii) the natural gas pipeline, case number PUE 860065, for which the State 67 Corporation Commission has issued a certificate of public convenience and necessity; or **68** 

2. Be construed to prevent the construction, use, operation, and maintenance of a natural gas pipeline (i) traversing the portion of the river designated by § 10.1-411.1 at, or at any point north of, 69 70 the existing power line that is located approximately 200 feet north of the northern entrance to the 71 Swede Tunnel or (ii) on or beneath the two existing railroad trestles, one located just south of the 72 Swede Tunnel and the other located just north of the confluence of the Guest River with the Clinch 73 74 River, or to prevent the use, operation, and maintenance of such railroad trestles in furtherance of the 75 construction, operation, use, and maintenance of such pipeline.

# § 10.1-409. Appomattox State Scenic River.

The Appomation River, 100 feet from the base of the Brasfield Dam, excluding the Port Walthall 77 78 Channel of the River, to the confluence with the James River, a distance of approximately 19.2 miles, is hereby designated as the Appomattox State Scenic River, a component of the Virginia Scenic Rivers 79 80 System.

81 Nothing in this section shall preclude the Commonwealth or a local governing body from 82 constructing, reconstructing, operating, or performing necessary maintenance on any road or bridge project. The owner of the Harvell Dam in the City of Petersburg may construct, reconstruct, operate, and 83 84 maintain the Harvell Dam subject to other law and regulation.

# § 10.1-410. Catoctin Creek State Scenic River.

A. The Catoctin Creek from bank to bank in Loudoun County from the Town of Waterford to its 86 87 junction with the Potomac River, a distance of approximately 16 river miles, is hereby designated as the 88 Catoctin Creek State Scenic River, a component of the Virginia Scenic Rivers System.

89 B. No dam or other structure that impedes the natural flow of Catoctin Creek shall be constructed, 90 operated, or maintained within the section of Catoctin Creek designated as a scenic river by this 91 legislation unless specifically authorized by an act of the General Assembly.

As used in this section, the words "dam or other structure" mean any structure extending from bank to bank of Catoctin Creek that will interfere with the normal movement of waterborne traffic, interfere 92 93 94 with the normal movement of fish or wildlife, raise the water level on the upstream side of the structure 95 or lower the water level on the downstream side of the structure. 96

# § 10.1-410.1. Chickahominy State Scenic River.

A. The main channel of the Chickahominy River from the Mechanicsville Turnpike (Route 360) 97 98 eastward until the terminus of the Henrico County/Hanover County border, is hereby designated as the 99 Chickahominy State Scenic River, a component of the Virginia Scenic Rivers System.

100 B. Nothing in this chapter shall preclude the construction or reconstruction of any road or bridge by 101 the Commonwealth or by any county, city or town.

102 C. Nothing in this chapter shall preclude the construction, operation, repair, maintenance, or replacement of a natural gas pipeline for which the State Corporation Commission has issued a 103 certificate of public convenience and necessity or any connections with such pipeline owned by the 104 Richmond Gas Utility and connected to such pipeline. 105

# § 10.1-410.2. Clinch State Scenic River.

107 The Clinch River in Russell County from its confluence with the Little River to the Nash Ford 108 Bridge at mile 279.5, a distance of approximately 20 miles and including its tributary, Big Cedar Creek from the confluence to mile 5.8 near Lebanon, is hereby designated as the Clinch State Scenic River, a 109 110 component of the Virginia Scenic Rivers System.

## § 10.1-411. Goose Creek State Scenic River.

A. Goose Creek, from bank to bank in Fauquier and Loudoun Counties from the confluence of the 112 113 North and South Prongs of Goose Creek approximately 0.22 mile downstream of the crossing of the Appalachian Trail in Fauquier County to its junction with the Potomac River in Loudoun County, a 114 distance of approximately 48 river miles, is hereby designated as the Goose Creek State Scenic River, a 115 116 component of the Virginia Scenic Rivers System.

B. The Northern Virginia Regional Park Authority is authorized to acquire, either by gift or 117 purchase, any real property or interests therein that the Northern Virginia Regional Park Authority 118 119 considers necessary or desirable to provide public use areas as identified in the Goose Creek Scenic River Report published in 1975. 120

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121 C. No new dam or other structure or enlargement of an existing dam or other structure that impedes 122 the natural flow of Goose Creek shall be constructed, operated or maintained within the section of 123 Goose Creek designated as a Scenic River by this legislation unless specifically authorized by an act of 124 the General Assembly.

125 As used in this section, the words "dam or other structure" mean any structure extending from bank 126 to bank of Goose Creek that will interfere with the normal movement of waterborne traffic, interfere 127 with the normal movement of fish or wildlife, or raise the water level on the upstream side of the 128 structure or lower the water level on the downstream side of the structure.

129 D. Nothing in this chapter shall preclude the continued use, operation, and maintenance of the 130 existing Fairfax City water impoundment, or the installation of new water intake facilities in the existing 131 reservoir located within the designated section of Goose Creek. 132

#### § 10.1-411.1. Clinch-Guest State Scenic River.

133 A. The Clinch River from the Route 58 bridge in St. Paul to the junction with the Guest River, a 134 distance of approximately 9.2 miles, and a segment of the Guest River in Wise County, from a point 135 100 feet downstream from the Route 72 bridge to its confluence with the Clinch River, a distance of approximately 6.5 miles, are hereby designated as the Clinch-Guest State Scenic River, a component of 136 137 the Virginia Scenic Rivers System; however, this description shall not be construed as making the lands 138 along such river unsuitable for underground mining pursuant to § 45.1-252 or regulations promulgated 139 thereunder.

**140** B. Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to prevent the construction, use, operation and 141 maintenance of a natural gas pipeline on or beneath the two existing railroad trestles, one located just 142 south of the Swede Tunnel and the other located just north of the confluence of the Guest River with 143 the Clinch River, or to prevent the use, operation and maintenance of such railroad trestles in 144 furtherance of the construction, operation, use and maintenance of such pipeline. Nothing in this chapter 145 shall be construed to prevent the construction, use, operation and maintenance of a natural gas pipeline 146 traversing the river at, or at any point north of, the existing power line that is located approximately 200 147 feet north of the northern entrance to the Swede Tunnel.

148 C. Nothing in this chapter shall preclude the federal government, Commonwealth or a local 149 jurisdiction from constructing or reconstructing any road or bridge.

#### 150 § 10.1-411.2. Russell Fork State Scenic River.

151 A. The Russell Fork River from the Splashdam railroad crossing to the Kentucky state line, a 152 distance of nine miles in Dickenson County, is hereby designated as the Russell Fork State Scenic River, 153 a component of the Virginia Scenic Rivers System.

154 B. Nothing in this chapter shall preclude the construction or reconstruction of any road or bridge by 155 the Commonwealth or by any county, city, or town. 156

#### § 10.1-411.3. Banister State Scenic River.

157 A. The Banister River from the Route 29 bridge in Pittsylvania County to the confluence with the 158 Dan River in Halifax County, a distance of approximately 63.3 miles, is hereby designated as the 159 Banister State Scenic River, a component of the Virginia Scenic Rivers System.

160 B. Nothing in this section shall preclude the Commonwealth or a local governing body from 161 constructing, reconstructing, or performing necessary maintenance on any road or bridge.

#### § 10.1-411.4. Cranesnest State Scenic River.

163 A. The Cranesnest River from Route 637 to the Flanagan Reservoir Cranesnest Launch Ramp in 164 Dickenson County, a distance of approximately 10.7 miles, is hereby designated as the Cranesnest State 165 Scenic River, a component of the Virginia Scenic Rivers System.

166 B. Nothing in this section shall preclude the Commonwealth or a local governing body from 167 constructing, reconstructing, or performing necessary maintenance on any road or bridge.

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## § 10.1-412. Historic Falls of the James State Scenic River.

169 A. The Historic Falls of the James from Orleans Street extended in the City of Richmond westward 170 to the 1970 corporate limits of the city is hereby designated as the Historic Falls of the James State 171 Scenic River, a component of the Virginia Scenic Rivers System.

172 B. The City of Richmond shall be allowed to reconstruct, operate and maintain existing facilities at 173 the Byrd Park and Hollywood Hydroelectric Power Stations at current capacity.

174 C. Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to prevent the Commonwealth, the City of Richmond or 175 any common carrier railroad from constructing or reconstructing floodwalls or public common carrier 176 facilities that may traverse the river, such as road or railroad bridges, raw water intake structures, or 177 water or sewer lines that would be constructed below water level.

#### 178 § 10.1-413. James State Scenic River.

179 A. That portion of the James River in Botetourt County, from a point two miles southeast of the 180 point where Route 43 (old Route 220) crosses the James River at Eagle Rock running approximately 14 181 miles southeastward to the point where Route 630 crosses the James River at Springwood is hereby

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182 designated as the James State Scenic River, a component of the Virginia Scenic Rivers System.

183 B. No dam or other structure that impedes the natural flow of the James River in Botetourt County 184 shall be constructed, operated or maintained within the section of the James River designated as a scenic 185 river by this statute unless specifically authorized by an act of the General Assembly.

#### 186 § 10.1-413.1. Moormans State Scenic River.

187 A. The Moormans River in Albemarle County, from the Charlottesville Reservoir to its junction with 188 the Mechums River, is hereby designated as the Moormans State Scenic River, a component of the 189 Virginia Scenic Rivers System.

190 B. No dam or other structure impeding the natural flow of the river shall be constructed, operated, or 191 maintained unless specifically authorized by an act of the General Assembly. 192

# § 10.1-413.2. North Landing and Tributaries State Scenic River.

A. The North Landing from the North Carolina line to the bridge at Route 165, the Pocaty River 193 from its junction with the North Landing River to the Blackwater Road bridge, West Neck Creek from 194 195 the junction with the North Landing River to Indian River Road bridge, and Blackwater Creek from the 196 junction with the North Landing River to the confluence, approximately 4.2 miles, of an unnamed 197 tributary approximately 1.75 miles, more or less, west of Blackwater Road, are hereby designated as the 198 North Landing and Tributaries State Scenic River, components of the Virginia Scenic Rivers System.

199 B. No dam or other structure impeding the natural flow of the river shall be constructed, operated, or 200 maintained unless specifically authorized by an act of the General Assembly.

### § 10.1-413.3. Dan State Scenic River.

202 A. The Dan River from Berry Hill Road at Route 880 in Pittsylvania County to the downstream 203 property boundary of Abreu/Grogan Park in Danville, a distance of approximately 15 miles, and the Dan River from the North Carolina-Virginia state line in Halifax County to the confluence with Aaron's 204 Creek in Halifax County, a distance of approximately 38.6 miles, are hereby designated as the Dan State 205 206 Scenic River, components of the Virginia Scenic Rivers System.

B. Nothing in this section shall preclude the Commonwealth or a local governing body from 207 208 constructing, reconstructing, operating, or performing necessary maintenance on any road or bridge in 209 the designated areas. 210

# § 10.1-414. Nottoway State Scenic River.

The Nottoway River in Sussex County and Southampton County, from the Route 40 bridge at Stony 211 212 Creek to the North Carolina line, a distance of approximately 72.5 miles, is hereby designated as the 213 Nottoway State Scenic River, a component of the Virginia Scenic Rivers System.

214 Nothing in this section shall preclude the Commonwealth or a local governing body from 215 constructing, reconstructing, operating, or performing necessary maintenance on any transportation or 216 public water supply project. 217

## § 10.1-415. Rappahannock State Scenic River.

A. The mainstem of the Rappahannock River in Rappahannock, Culpeper, Fauquier, Stafford, and 218 219 Spotsylvania Counties and the City of Fredericksburg from its headwaters near Chester Gap to the Ferry Farm-Mayfield Bridge, a distance of approximately 86 river miles, is hereby designated as the 220 221 Rappahannock State Scenic River, a component of the Virginia Scenic Rivers System.

222 B. Nothing in this chapter shall preclude the continued operation and maintenance of existing dams 223 in the designated section.

224 C. Nothing in this chapter shall preclude the continued operation, maintenance, alteration, expansion, 225 or destruction of the Embrey Dam or its appurtenances by the City of Fredericksburg, including the old 226 VEPCO canal and the existing City Reservoir behind the Embrey Dam, or any other part of the City's 227 waterworks.

228 D. Nothing in this chapter shall preclude the Commonwealth, the City of Fredericksburg, or the 229 Counties of Stafford, Spotsylvania, or Culpeper from constructing or reconstructing any road or bridge 230 or from constructing any new raw water intake structures or devices, including pipes and reservoirs but 231 not dams, or laying water or sewer lines below water level.

232 E. Nothing in this chapter shall preclude the construction, operation, repair, maintenance, or 233 replacement of the natural gas pipeline, case number PUE 860065, for which the State Corporation 234 Commission has issued a certificate of public convenience and necessity. 235

## § 10.1-415.1. Rockfish State Scenic River.

236 A. The Rockfish River in Albemarle and Nelson Counties from the Route 693 bridge in Schuyler to 237 its confluence with the James River, a distance of approximately 9.75 miles, is hereby designated as the 238 Rockfish State Scenic River, a component of the Virginia Scenic Rivers System.

239 B. Nothing in this chapter shall preclude the Commonwealth or local governing body from constructing or reconstructing any road or bridge. 240 241

## § 10.1-416. Rivanna State Scenic River.

242 A. The river, stream, or waterway known as the Rivanna from the base of the South Fork Rivanna River reservoir to the junction of the Rivanna with the James River, a distance of approximately 46 243

244 miles, is hereby designated as the Rivanna State Scenic River, a component of the Virginia Scenic 245 Rivers System.

246 B. No dam or other structure impeding the natural flow of the river shall be constructed, operated, or 247 maintained unless specifically authorized by an act of the General Assembly.

248 C. Nothing in this section shall preclude the Commonwealth or a local governing body from 249 constructing, reconstructing, or performing necessary maintenance on any road or bridge.

250 § 10.1-417. Shenandoah State Scenic River.

251 A. The Shenandoah River in Clarke County from the Warren-Clarke County line to the Virginia line, 252 a distance of approximately 21.6 miles, is hereby designated as the Shenandoah State Scenic River, a 253 component of the Virginia Scenic Rivers System.

254 B. No dam or other structure that impedes the natural flow of the Shenandoah River shall be 255 constructed, operated, or maintained within the section of the Shenandoah River designated as a scenic 256 river by this legislation unless specifically authorized by an act of the General Assembly.

257 As used in this section, the words "dam or other structure" mean any structure extending from bank 258 to bank of the Shenandoah River that will interfere with the normal movement of fish or wildlife, raise 259 the water level on the upstream side of the structure or lower the water level on the downstream side of 260 the structure.

#### § 10.1-418. Staunton State Scenic River.

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262 The river, stream, or waterway known as the Staunton or the Roanoke, from State Route 360 to State 263 Route 761 at the Long Island Bridge, a distance of approximately 51.3 river miles, is hereby designated 264 as the Staunton State Scenic River, a component of the Virginia Scenic Rivers System.

#### 265 § 10.1-418.1. North Meherrin State Scenic River.

266 The North Meherrin River in Lunenburg County from the Route 712 Bridge to the junction with the 267 South Meherrin River, a distance of approximately 7.5 miles, is hereby designated as the North 268 Meherrin State Scenic River, a component of the Virginia Scenic Rivers System. 269

### § 10.1-418.2. St. Mary's State Scenic River.

270 A. As Because the authority of the federal government over the St. Mary's River prevents the 271 Commonwealth from legally including the river as a component of the Virginia Scenic Rivers System, 272 the segment of the St. Mary's River from its headwaters to the border of the George Washington 273 National Forest, all on national forest property, is hereby recognized as one of Virginia's Scenic River 274 resources and is worthy of designation as such.

275 B. All land and water uses along this portion of the St. Mary's River that are permitted by law shall 276 not be restricted.

277 C. The Department shall consult with the Augusta County Board of Supervisors and the Supervisor 278 of the George Washington National Forest on matters related to this Scenic River scenic river.

#### 279 § 10.1-418.3. Meherrin State Scenic River.

280 The Meherrin River within Mecklenburg, Lunenburg, and Brunswick Counties from the confluence 281 with the North Meherrin River, a designated scenic river, to the Brunswick/Greensville County line, a 282 distance of approximately 54.8 miles, is hereby designated as the Meherrin State Scenic River, a 283 component of the Virginia Scenic Rivers System. Nothing in this section shall preclude the 284 Commonwealth or a local governing body from constructing, reconstructing, or performing necessary 285 maintenance on any road or bridge.

#### § 10.1-418.4. North Mayo State Scenic River.

287 The North Mayo River in Henry County from the Route 695 crossing to the North Carolina line, a 288 distance of approximately 7.1 miles, is hereby designated as the North Mayo State Scenic River, a component of the Virginia Scenic Rivers System. Nothing in this section shall preclude the 289 290 Commonwealth or a local governing body from constructing, reconstructing, or performing necessary 291 maintenance on any road or bridge. 292

### § 10.1-418.5. South Mayo State Scenic River.

293 The South Mayo River in Henry County from the Patrick County line to the North Carolina line, a 294 distance of approximately 6.9 miles, is hereby designated as the South Mayo State Scenic River, a 295 component of the Virginia Scenic Rivers System. Nothing in this section shall preclude the 296 Commonwealth or a local governing body from constructing, reconstructing, or performing necessary 297 maintenance on any road or bridge. 298

## § 10.1-418.6. Blackwater State Scenic River.

299 The Blackwater River in Isle of Wight and Southampton Counties and the Cities of Franklin and 300 Suffolk, from Proctor's Bridge at Route 621 to its confluence with the Nottoway River at the North Carolina line, a distance of approximately 56 miles, is hereby designated as the Blackwater State Scenic 301 302 River, a component of the Virginia Scenic Rivers System. Nothing in this section shall preclude the 303 Commonwealth or a local governing body from constructing, reconstructing, operating, or performing 304 necessary maintenance on any transportation or public water supply project.

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#### 305 § 10.1-418.7. Jordan State Scenic River.

306 The Jordan River in Rappahannock County, from the Route 522 bridge at Flint Hill to its confluence 307 with the Rappahannock River, a distance of approximately seven miles, is hereby designated as the 308 Jordan State Scenic River, a component of the Virginia Scenic Rivers System. Nothing in this section 309 shall preclude the Commonwealth or a local governing body from constructing, reconstructing, or 310 performing necessary maintenance on any road or bridge.

# § 10.1-418.8. Hughes State Scenic River.

312 The Hughes River in Culpeper, Madison, and Rappahannock Counties from the Shenandoah National 313 Park line in Madison County to its confluence with the Hazel River, a distance of approximately 10 314 miles, is hereby designated as the Hughes State Scenic River, a component of the Virginia Scenic Rivers System. Nothing in this section shall preclude the Commonwealth or a local governing body from 315 316 constructing, reconstructing, or performing necessary maintenance on any road or bridge.

## § 10.1-418.9. Tye State Scenic River.

The Tye River in Nelson County from Route 738 (Tye Depot Road) to its confluence with the James 318 River, a distance of approximately 12.7 miles, is hereby designated as the Tye State Scenic River, a 319 320 component of the Virginia Scenic Rivers System. Nothing in this section shall preclude the 321 Commonwealth or a local governing body from constructing, reconstructing, or performing necessary 322 maintenance on any road or bridge.

# § 15.2-5704.1. Northern Virginia Regional Park Authority.

324 The Northern Virginia Regional Park Authority is authorized to acquire, either by gift or purchase, 325 any real property or interests therein that the Northern Virginia Regional Park Authority considers 326 necessary or desirable to provide public use areas as identified in the Goose Creek Scenic River Report 327 published in 1975.
