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10	WHEREAS, the Vera Institute of Justice reported that 95 percent of prisoners are eventually released
11	back into the community; and
12 13	WHEREAS, educational and vocational training programs for prisoners are used to provide them with knowledge and skills that will help them to become productive members of society upon mentry.
13 14	with knowledge and skills that will help them to become productive members of society upon reentry, secure employment, provide for their families, and serve their communities; and
15	WHEREAS, participation in educational and vocational training programs also lowers the likelihood
16	that a prisoner will re-engage in criminal activity upon reentry and return to the corrections system; and
17 18	WHEREAS, the Vera Institute of Justice reported that only one-third of prisoners receive vocational
10 19	training during incarceration and that a mere six percent receive access to higher education; and WHEREAS, it is in the Commonwealth's best social and financial interests to ensure that prisoners
20	are given adequate educational opportunities and vocational training during incarceration to encourage
21	their successful reentry and lower the odds of their returning to the Commonwealth's corrections system;
22	now, therefore, be it
23 24	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission be directed to study the adequacy of prisoner educational and vocational training
25	programs.
26	In conducting its study, the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission shall (i) identify all
27	educational and vocational training programs provided to prisoners in the Commonwealth; (ii) calculate
28 29	the percentage of prisoners who participate in such educational and vocational training programs; (iii) identify and analyze any correlation between participation in such programs and successful reentry into
3 0	the community, including correlations related to employment and recidivism; and (iv) make
31	recommendations to improve current educational and vocational training programs, create additional
32	programs, and increase the number of prisoners participating in such programs.
33 34	All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission for this study, upon request.
35	The Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission (JLARC) shall complete its meetings by
36	November 30, 2018, and the chairman shall submit to the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an
37	executive summary of its findings and recommendations no later than the first day of the 2019 Regular
38 39	Session of the General Assembly. The executive summary shall state whether JLARC intends to submit to the General Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings and recommendations for publication
40	as a House or Senate document. The executive summary and report shall be submitted as provided in
41	the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative
42	documents and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.

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
