5 WHEREAS, the March for Life, an annual rally to protest the practice of abortion, promote the value
7 of human life, and advocate on behalf of unborn children, held its 45th march in 2018; and

8 WHEREAS, established in October 1973, the first March for Life was organized by the late Nellie
9 Gray, a pro-life activist, as a response to the landmark ruling in <u>Roe v.</u> Wade, which legalized abortion
10 in the United States; and

WHEREAS, held in January each year, the March for Life has grown from a small demonstration to
 the largest pro-life event in the world, with thousands of attendees meeting at the National Mall and
 marching to the United States Supreme Court Building; and

14 WHEREAS, the March for Life strives to create a world where every human life is valued and 15 protected and raises awareness of the effects of legalized abortion on the lives of women and unborn 16 children; and

WHEREAS, the March for Life provides an opportunity for pro-life groups to unite around acommon message of the importance of every human life and work to communicate that message togovernment officials and members of the public in a peaceful, powerful way; and

WHEREAS, the March for Life draws pro-life activists and leaders from many walks of life, and
many pro-life events are held in conjunction with the rally, such as candlelight vigils, prayer services,
and conferences; in 2010, the nonprofit organization Americans United for Life created an online virtual
march for people unable to travel to Washington, D.C.; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly hereby
 commend the March for Life on the occasion of its 45th anniversary in 2018; and, be it

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution
 for presentation to the March for Life as an expression of the General Assembly's admiration for its
 life-affirming mission.
