10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:		
11	1. That § 10.1-2211.2 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:		
12	§ 10.1-2211.2. Disbursement of funds appropriated for caring for historical African American		
13 14	cemeteries and graves.		
14 15	A. For purposes of this section: "Historical African American comptery" means a comptery that was established prior to January 1		
16	"Historical African American cemetery" means a cemetery that was established prior to January 1, 1900, for interments of African Americans and is owned by a public body or qualified charitable		
17	organization.		
18	"Qualified charitable organization" means a charitable corporation, charitable association, or		
19	charitable trust that has been granted tax-exempt status under § 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code		
20	and whose primary purpose is the preservation of historical cemeteries and graves.		
21	B. At the direction of the Director, the Comptroller of the Commonwealth shall draw an annual		
22	warrant upon the State Treasurer from any sum that may be provided in the general appropriation act in		
23 24	favor of the treasurer of a qualified charitable organization caring for any cemetery set forth in this subsection. Such appropriations shall be allocated on the basis of the number of graves, monuments, and		
24 25	markers in a cemetery of African Americans who lived at any time between January 1, 1800, and		
2 6	January 1, 1900, the dates to be determined by reference to grave marke

28	the cemetery name or as documented by the qualified charitable organization, shall be multiplied by the		
29	rate of \$5 or the average actual cost of routine maintenance of a g

42	C. An organization receiving funds shall expend the funds for the	,	
43	historical African American cemetery and its graves and the erection of and caring for markers,		
44	memorials, and monuments to the memory of such African Americans.		

45 D. Each qualified charitable organization, through its proper officer, shall after July 1 of each year submit to the Director a certified statement that the funds appropriated to the organization during the 46 47 preceding fiscal year were or will be expended for the purposes set forth in subsection C. No organization that fails to comply with any of the requirements of this section shall receive moneys 48 49 allocated under this section for any subsequent fiscal year until the organization fully complies with the 50 requirements.

51 E. In addition to funds that may be provided pursuant to subsection B, any organization set forth in 52 subsection B may apply to the Director for a grant to perform extraordinary maintenance, renovation, repair, or reconstruction of any of its historical African American cemeteries and graves. Such a grant 53 shall be made from any appropriation made available by the General Assembly for such purpose. 54 55

F. No local matching funds shall be required for any grants made pursuant to this section. § 10.1-2211.2. Disbursement of funds appropriated for caring for historical African American

58 A. For purposes of this section:

59 "Historical African American cemetery" means a cemetery that was established prior to January 1, 60 1900, for interments of African Americans and is owned by a public body or qualified charitable61 organization.

⁶² "Qualified charitable organization" means a charitable corporation, charitable association, or
⁶³ charitable trust that has been granted tax-exempt status under § 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code
⁶⁴ and whose primary purpose is the preservation of historical cemeteries and graves.

65 B. At the direction of the Director, the Comptroller of the Commonwealth shall draw an annual 66 warrant upon the State Treasurer from any sum that may be provided in the general appropriation act in favor of the treasurer of a qualified charitable organization caring for any cemetery set forth in this 67 subsection. Such appropriations shall be allocated on the basis of the number of graves, monuments, and **68** markers in a cemetery of African Americans who lived at any time between January 1, 1800, and 69 January 1, 1900, the dates to be determined by reference to grave markers or, at the discretion of the 70 Director, other historical records. Such number of graves, monuments, and markers, as set forth opposite 71 72 the cemetery name or as documented by the qualified charitable organization, shall be multiplied by the rate of \$5 or the average actual cost of routine maintenance of a grave, monument, or marker, 73 whichever is greater, to determine the amount of the allocation. The Department shall determine the 74 75 average actual cost of routine maintenance of a grave, monument, or marker in a biennial survey of at least four properly maintained cemeteries, each located in a different geographical region of the 76 77 Commonwealth.

C. An organization receiving funds shall expend the funds for the routine maintenance of its
historical African American cemetery and its graves and the erection of and caring for markers,
memorials, and monuments to the memory of such African Americans.

D. Each qualified charitable organization, through its proper officer, shall after July 1 of each year
submit to the Director a certified statement that the funds appropriated to the organization during the
preceding fiscal year were or will be expended for the purposes set forth in subsection C. No
organization that fails to comply with any of the requirements of this section shall receive moneys
allocated under this section for any subsequent fiscal year until the organization fully complies with the

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
