That § 18.2-308.010 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 11 § 18.2-308.010. Renewal of concealed handgun permit. 12 13 A. 1. Persons who previously have held a concealed handgun permit shall be issued, upon 14 application as provided in § 18.2-308.02, a new five-year permit unless it is found that the applicant is subject to any of the disgualifications set forth in § 18.2-308.09. Persons who previously have been 15 16 issued a concealed handgun permit pursuant to this article shall not be required to appear in person to apply for a new five-year permit pursuant to this section, and the application for the new permit, 17 including a photocopy of the applicant's valid photo identification, may be submitted via the United 18 19 States mail. The circuit court that receives the application shall promptly notify an applicant if the 20 application is incomplete or if the fee submitted for the permit pursuant to § 18.2-308.03 is incorrect. 21 2. If a new five-year permit is issued while an existing permit remains valid, the new five-year 22 permit shall become effective upon the expiration date of the existing permit, provided that the 23 application is received by the court at least 90 days but no more than 180 days prior to the expiration of 24 the existing permit. 25 3. Any order denying issuance of the new permit shall be in accordance with subsection A of 26 § 18.2-308.08. 27 B. If a permit holder is a member of the Virginia National Guard, Armed Forces of the United 28 States, or the Armed Forces Reserves of the United States, and his five-year permit expires during an 29 active-duty military deployment outside of the permittee's county or city of residence, such permit shall 30 remain valid for 90 days after the end date of the deployment. In order to establish proof of continued 31 validity of the permit, such a permittee shall carry with him and display, upon request of a law-enforcement officer, a copy of the permittee's deployment orders or other documentation from the 32 33 permittee's commanding officer that order the permittee to travel outside of his county or city of residence and that indicate the start and end date of such deployment. 34 35 C. If the clerk has an electronic system for, and issuance of, concealed handgun permits and such 36 system has the capability of sending electronic notices to permit holders and if a permit holder requests 37 such notice on the concealed handgun application form, the clerk that issued the permit shall notify the permit holder by electronic mail at least 90 days prior to the permit expiration date that the permit will 38 39 expire. Unless the clerk has sent an electronic notice of expiration to the permit holder, the clerk shall send a notice of expiration to the permit holder by first-class mail at least 90 days prior to the permit 40 41 expiration. The failure of a clerk to send the notice required by this subsection or the failure of the permit holder to receive such notice shall not extend the validity of the existing permit beyond its 42 43 expiration date.
