Patrons Prior to Engrossment—Senators Stanley and McClellan; Delegate: Kory 8 Referred to Committee on Education and Health 9 10 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. § 1. That the Virginia Community College System (VCCS) shall establish a two-year pilot program, to 11 be referred to as the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Scholarship Pilot Program (the 12 Program), beginning in 2018 for the purpose of providing access to postsecondary educational 13 opportunities to students living in poverty. The Program shall provide to selected students who meet the 14 15 TANF eligibility requirements scholarships to select comprehensive community colleges in VCCS. 16 Program funds shall be used to make payments for [ the costs of tuition and books in advance of a 17 student's enrollment in a any part of a student's cost of attendance not already covered by other grant aid at the ] participating comprehensive community college. [ Cost of attendance includes tuition, fees, 18 19 books, living expenses, transportation, and personal expenses. 20 § 2. The Program shall be funded with federal TANF block grant funds appropriated for this 21 purpose. Such funds shall be used to provide to 200 students participating in the program a maximum 22 of \$4,000 each per year. Such funds shall be paid to VCCS for disbursement to participating 23 comprehensive community colleges. 24  $\S$  3. The Program shall be implemented at two or more comprehensive community colleges, at least 25 one of which shall be located in an urban area and at least one of which shall be located in a rural area. Comprehensive community colleges participating or applying to participate in the Program shall 26 27 submit information outlining educational and vocational programs offered at the applying or participating comprehensive community college that have been shown, through surveys or other 28 29 assessments, to lead to self-sufficiency for enrolled students, including programs in which students 30 receive a degree or qualifications necessary to obtain licensure or certification in a specific field of 31 employment. 32 § 4. VCCS and the Virginia Department of Social Services shall enter into a memorandum of 33 understanding establishing the parameters of the Program and the method for selecting students to 34 participate in the Program. VCCS shall monitor, record, and analyze the outcomes of all students 35 participating in the Program. 36 § 5. VCCS shall report to the Governor and the General Assembly no later than December 1 of each 37 year of the Program. Such report shall include (i) the number of students who were eligible to 38 participate in the Program, (ii) the number of students selected to participate in the Program, (iii) the 39 criteria for selection and other nonidentifying statistical information about students selected to 40 participate in the Program, (iv) student outcome analysis and evaluation, (v) methods used to assess 41 student outcomes, (vi) information regarding the comprehensive community colleges selected to 42 participate in the Program and the areas in which such comprehensive community colleges are located, (vii) actual expenditures for the Program, and (viii) any other information deemed necessary by VCCS 43 to evaluate the effectiveness of the Program. 44 2. That the provisions of this act shall not become effective unless an appropriation effectuating 45 the purposes of this act is included in a general appropriation act passed in 2018 by the General 46 47 Assembly that becomes law.
