10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11 12	1. That § 30-34.2:2 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12 13	§ 30-34.2:2. Disposal of unclaimed firearms, other weapons, or other unclaimed personal property in possession of the Division of Capitol Police.
13 14	Subject to the provisions of § 19.2-386.29, the Division of Capitol Police may destroy unclaimed
14	firearms and other weapons, and may lawfully dispose of other unclaimed personal property, that have
15 16	been in the possession of the Division for a period of more than 120 days. For the purposes of this
17	section, "unclaimed firearms and other weapons" means any firearm or other weapon belonging to
18	another that has been acquired by a law-enforcement officer pursuant to his duties, that is not needed in
19	any criminal prosecution, that has not been claimed by its rightful owner, and that the State Treasurer
20	has indicated will be declined if remitted under the Uniform Disposition of Unclaimed Property Act
21	(§ 55-210.1 et seq.), and "unclaimed personal property" means any personal property belonging to
22	another that has been acquired by a law-enforcement officer pursuant to his duties, that is not needed in
23	any criminal prosecution, that has not been claimed by its rightful owner, and that the State Treasurer
24	has indicated will be declined if remitted under the Uniform Disposition of Unclaimed Property Act
25	(§ 55-210.1 et seq.).
26	At the discretion of the chief of police or his designee, the Division of Capitol Police may destroy
27	unclaimed firearms or other weapons may be destroyed by any means that renders the firearms or other
28	weapons permanently inoperable and may lawfully dispose of other unclaimed personal property. Prior
29	to the destruction of such unclaimed firearms or other weapons or disposal of such other unclaimed
30	personal property, the chief of police or his designee shall (i) make reasonable attempts to notify by
31	mail the rightful owner of the property and (ii) obtain from the attorney for the Commonwealth of the
32	jurisdiction from which the unclaimed item came into the possession of the Division of Capitol Police in
33	writing a statement advising that the item is not needed in any criminal prosecution. The Division may
34	dispose of an unclaimed bicycle, electric personal assistive mobility device, electric power-assisted

35 36 bicycle, or moped in accordance with the provisions of § 15.2-1720. In lieu of destroying any such unclaimed firearm, the chief of police or his designee may donate the firearm to the Department of Forensic Science, upon agreement of the Department. 37
