A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 22.1-207.1 and 22.1-207.1:1 of the Code of Virginia, relating to family life education; child sexual abuse.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That §§ 22.1-207.1 and 22.1-207.1:10f the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as 11 12 follows: 13

§ 22.1-207.1. Family life education.

14 A. As used in this section, "abstinence education" means an educational or motivational component 15 that has as its exclusive purpose teaching the social, psychological, and health gains to be realized by 16 teenagers' abstaining from sexual activity before marriage.

B. The Board of Education shall develop Standards of Learning and curriculum guidelines for a 17 comprehensive, sequential family life education curriculum in grades kindergarten through 12. Such 18 19 curriculum guidelines shall include instruction as appropriate for the age of the student in family living 20 and community relationships; the benefits, challenges, responsibilities, and value of marriage for men, 21 women, children, and communities; the value of family relationships; abstinence education; the value of 22 postponing sexual activity; the benefits of adoption as a positive choice in the event of an unwanted 23 pregnancy; human sexuality; human reproduction; dating violence, the characteristics of abusive 24 relationships, steps to take to deter sexual assault, and the availability of counseling and legal resources, 25 and, in the event of such sexual assault, the importance of immediate medical attention and advice, as well as the requirements of the law; the etiology, prevention, and effects of sexually transmitted 26 27 diseases; and mental health education and awareness. Such standards of learning shall also include 28 age-appropriate instruction in the prevention, recognition, and awareness of child abduction, child 29 abuse, child sexual exploitation, and child sexual abuse.

30 C. All such instruction shall be designed to promote parental involvement, foster positive self-concepts, and provide mechanisms for coping with peer pressure and the stresses of modern living according to the students' developmental stages and abilities. The Board shall also establish requirements 31 32 33 for appropriate training for teachers of family life education, which shall include training in instructional 34 elements to support the various curriculum components. 35

§ 22.1-207.1:1. Family life education; certain curricula and Standards of Learning.

36 A. Any family life education curriculum offered by a local school division shall require the 37 Standards of Learning objectives related to dating violence and the characteristics of abusive 38 relationships to be taught at least once in middle school and at least twice in high school, as described 39 in the Board of Education's family life education guidelines.

B. Any high school family life education curriculum offered by a local school division shall 40 41 incorporate age-appropriate elements of effective and evidence-based programs on the prevention of dating violence, domestic abuse, sexual harassment, and sexual violence and may incorporate 42 age-appropriate elements of effective and evidence-based programs on the law and meaning of consent. 43 Such age-appropriate elements of effective and evidence-based programs on the prevention of sexual 44 45 violence may include instruction that increases student awareness of the fact that consent is required 46 before sexual activity.

47 C. Any family life education curriculum offered by a local school division shall require the Standards 48 of Learning objectives related to the prevention, recognition, and awareness of child abduction, child abuse, child sexual exploitation, and child sexual abuse to be taught in grades K through 12. 49
