That § 2.2-2101 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted and that the Code of Virginia 12 is amended by adding in Article 2 of Chapter 14 of Title 22.1 a section numbered 22.1-275.2 as 13 14 follows: § 2.2-2101. Prohibition against service by legislators on boards, commissions, and councils 15 16 within the executive branch; exceptions. Members of the General Assembly shall be ineligible to serve on boards, commissions, and councils 17 18 within the executive branch of state government who are responsible for administering programs established by the General Assembly. Such prohibition shall not extend to boards, commissions, and 19 councils engaged solely in policy studies or commemorative activities. School Health Advisory Board.

A. The School Health Advisory Board (the Board) is established as an advisory board, within the meaning of § 2.2-2100, in the executive branch of state government. The purpose of the Board shall be to (i) advise the General Assembly and the Governor on pending or proposed legislation concerning the role of employees in public elementary or secondary schools in providing health care services at such schools and (ii) provide guidance on any associated training requirements.

58 B. The Board shall consist of two legislative members, 10 nonlegislative citizen members, and two ex

officio members as follows: one member of the House of Delegates appointed by the Speaker of the
House of Delegates; one Senator appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules; three nonlegislative
citizen members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates; three nonlegislative citizen
members appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules; four nonlegislative citizen members appointed by
the Governor, two of whom shall be public school educators and two of whom shall be health care
professionals; and the Secretary of Education, or his designee, and the Secretary of Health and Human
Resources, or his designee, who shall serve ex officio with voting privileges.

66 C. Nonlegislative citizen members appointed by the Governor shall serve for terms of four years, and
67 nonlegislative citizen members appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules and the Speaker of the
68 House of Delegates shall serve for terms of two years. The Secretary of Education and the Secretary of
69 Health and Human Resources, or their designees, shall serve terms coincident with their terms of office.

70 Vacancies occurring other than by expiration of a term shall be filled for the unexpired term. Vacancies

shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointments. Any nonlegislative citizen member may
 be reappointed for successive terms.

D. The members of the Board shall elect a chairman and vice-chairman annually from among its
membership. The Board shall meet at such times as it deems appropriate or on call of the chairman. A
majority of the members of the Board shall constitute a quorum.

*E.* Nonlegislative citizen members shall receive no compensation for their services. However, all
members shall be reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of
their duties as provided in §§ 2.2-2813 and 2.2-2825. Funding for the costs of expenses of the members
shall be provided by the Department of Education.

80 F. The Department of Education shall provide staff support to the Board with assistance, as 81 necessary, from the Department of Health.

82 G. The chairman of the Board shall submit to the Governor and the General Assembly an annual
83 executive summary of the interim activity and work of the Board no later than the first day of each
84 regular session of the General Assembly. The executive summary shall be submitted as provided in the

procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents
 and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.
