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11	WHEREAS, in an increasingly competitive world economy, Virginia's economic strength depends
12 13	upon the education and skills of its workers; and
13 14	WHEREAS, as many as two-thirds of Virginia's jobs will require a postsecondary degree or credential over the coming decades; and
14	WHEREAS, the increasing costs of higher education and the growing debt burden for students may
16	limit access to educational opportunities and adversely affect growth in other sectors of Virginia's
17	economy; and
18	WHEREAS, an opportunity to earn a postsecondary education should be afforded not just to the
19	privileged or the few, and the Virginia Community College System was designed to meet the
20	educational and workforce development needs of all Virginians; and
21	WHEREAS, providing all Virginians the opportunity to attend a comprehensive community college
22	without paying tuition or fees can help ensure Virginia's economic future; now, therefore, be it
23	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Joint Legislative Audit and
24	Review Commission be directed to study the feasibility of providing Virginians the opportunity to attend
25	comprehensive community college without paying tuition or fees.
26	In conducting its study, the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission (JLARC) shall consider
27	(i) the costs and funding mechanisms associated with providing all Virginians the opportunity to attend a
28	comprehensive community college without paying tuition or fees, (ii) the economic benefit to the
29 30	Commonwealth, (iii) similar programs in other states such as Tennessee and Oregon, and (iv) any other related matters it deems relevant.
30 31	Technical assistance shall be provided to JLARC by the State Council of Higher Education for
31 32	Virginia and the State Board of Community Colleges. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide
33	assistance to JLARC for this study, upon request.
34	The Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission shall complete its meetings by November 30,
35	2018, and the chairman shall submit to the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an executive
36	summary of its findings and recommendations no later than the first day of the 2019 Regular Session of
37	the General Assembly. The executive summary shall state whether JLARC intends to submit to the
38	General Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings and recommendations for publication as a
39	House or Senate document. The executive summary and report shall be submitted as provided in the
40	procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents
41	and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.
