3 4	Requesting the Virginia Department of Transportation to study the feasibility of an eastern bypass for
5	U.S. Route 29 around Charlottesville. Report.

10	WHEREAS, a project aimed to move traffic around Albemarle County's rapidly growing
11	Charlottesville corridor on U.S. Route 29 was originally conceived in the 1980s, with the Virginia
12	Department of Transportation (the Department) beginning to purchase land for a proposed western
13 14	bypass in the early 1990s; and WHEREAS, the proposed western bypass faced strong opposition from the Albemarle County Board
15	of Supervisors for over 20 years until June 8, 2011, when supervisors changed policy positions, at which
16	point the Commonwealth Transportation Board started allocating funding for the construction; and
17 18	WHEREAS, the western bypass project was abandoned in 2014 after the Federal Highway Safety Administration wrote a letter to the Department calling into question the possible environmental impacts
19	of such bypass; and
20	WHEREAS, over \$200 million dollars in funding was reallocated to other congestion-mitigating
21 22	projects affecting and surrounding U.S. Route 29 in and around Charlottesville through a project called Route 29 Solutions; and
23	WHEREAS, the U.S. Route 29 corridor is still in need of an overarching congestion-mitigating
24	transportation solution to allow commuters and travelers to bypass the inevitable traffic caused by the
25 26	University of Virginia and the area's hospital facilities; and WHEREAS, the rural areas east of U.S. Route 29 present a viable and appealing option for
27	constructing a bypass that would allow travelers and commuters to more quickly traverse the corridor
28	without adding to the congestion to the already overused U.S. Route 29 in Charlottesville; now,
29 30	therefore, be it RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Virginia Department of
31	Transportation be requested to study the feasibility of an eastern bypass for U.S. Route 29 around
32 33	Charlottesville.
33 34	In conducting its study, the Department shall review and catalogue the land east of U.S. Route 29, consider the current traffic conditions on U.S. Route 29 in Charlottesville, meet with local business
35	owners and employees of the University of Virginia and the University of Virginia Health System, and
36 37	research possible funding options for such development. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Department for this study, upon
37 38	request.
39	The Virginia Department of Transportation shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2018, and
40 41	shall submit to the Governor and the General Assembly an executive summary and a report of its findings and recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summary
42	and report shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated
43	Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports no later than the first day of the 2019
44	Regular Session of the General Assembly and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.
