8 9	WITEDEAS the Department of Transportation released a report (the Depart) in 1000 entitled "Deute
9 10	WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation released a report (the Report) in 1999 entitled "Route 60 Corridor Study: Amherst, Nelson, Appomattox, Buckingham, Cumberland, and Powhatan Counties";
10	and
12	WHEREAS, the Report concluded that recommended improvements to the Route 60 Corridor
13	included lane widening, widening of functionally obsolete bridges, and the addition of left and right turn
14	lanes; and
15	WHEREAS, the purpose of the Report was to identify major problem areas along the Route 60
16	Corridor with respect to the estimated year 2020 traffic demand and to recommend roadway
17	improvements that would enhance traffic movement and safety; and
18 19	WHEREAS, the Route 60 Corridor includes the Route 29 Bypass in Amherst County to west of
19 20	Route 522 in Powhatan County, a distance of approximately 68 miles; and WHEREAS, the residential, retail, and industrial development along the Route 60 Corridor has
<b>2</b> 0 <b>2</b> 1	increased exponentially since the Report was drafted and a new assessment is necessary to adequately
22	assess the Route 60 Corridor's increased traffic demand and subsequent recommended roadway
23	improvements; now, therefore, be it
24	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Department of
25	Transportation be requested to update its study of the Route 60 Corridor.
26	In conducting its study, the Department of Transportation shall review and update its 1999 report
27 28	entitled "Route 60 Corridor Study: Amherst, Nelson, Appomattox, Buckingham, Cumberland, and Powhatan Counties," taking into consideration (i) the increased residential, retail, and industrial
20 29	development along the corridor and the accompanying increased traffic volume; (ii) the shift from a
<b>3</b> 0	primarily rural facility to a semi-urban section through more developed areas; and (iii) whether the
31	existing alignment is adequate throughout most of the corridor.
32	All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Department of Transportation for
33	this study, upon request.
34	The Department of Transportation shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2018, and the
35	Secretary of Transportation shall submit to the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an executive
36 37	summary of its findings and recommendations no later than the first day of the 2019 Regular Session of the General Assembly. The executive summary shall state whether the Department of Transportation
37 38	intends to submit to the General Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings and
39	recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summary and report
10	shall be submitted as provided in the precedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for
