4. Title: Biased policing

5. Summary:

Currently, the Department of Criminal Justice Services is required by law to establish training standards, model policies, and statewide procedures that promote sensitivity to and awareness of cultural diversity and the potential for biased policing. The proposed legislation would require that these standards, policies, and procedures include recognizing implicit biases in interacting with persons who have a mental illness, substance abuse disorder, or developmental disability.

8. Fiscal Implications:

DCJS is currently updating its minimum compulsory training standards for law-enforcement and could, therefore, incorporate the more detailed requirements set out in the proposed legislation in its updates. To the extent that existing model policies and recommended statewide operating procedures and guidelines do not incorporate the populations set out in the proposed legislation, it is believed that they could be modified by the agency with its existing resources.
