3. Committee: Education

4. Title: SAT School Day Fund and Program established.

5. Summary: Establishes the SAT School Day Fund (the Fund) and requires the Board of Education to establish and maintain the SAT School Day Program (the Program) whereby the Board utilizes funds made available through the Fund to enter into a contract with the College Board to enable each public high school junior in the Commonwealth to participate in the SAT free of charge during a select school day.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Indeterminate. See Item 8.

8. Fiscal Implications: The Department of Education (DOE) estimates a cost of \$5.7 million per year to enable each public high school junior in the Commonwealth to participate in the SAT exam. This cost is based on an estimated 94,457 high school juniors in FY 2019 fall membership and a cost of \$60 per SAT exam registration. The state cost for the SAT School Day Program cannot be determined, though, as the bill does not require state funding, and any cost is dependent on the amount of funding appropriated by the General Assembly.

DOE anticipates that the agency can establish and administer the SAT School Day Program using existing staff and resources.
