- 4. Title: CCRE reports for trespassing and disorderly conduct
- **5. Summary:** Requires that law enforcement agencies make reports of all arrests for trespassing and disorderly conduct to the Central Criminal Records Exchange (CCRE). Such report must include the fingerprints and photograph of the arrested individual. Currently, such a report is required for all other misdemeanors that carry a potential jail sentence.
- 6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

- **8.** Fiscal Implications: The Department of State Police (VSP) administers and processes criminal history information that is stored in the CCRE. According to VSP, they do not anticipate any fiscal impact on agency operations as a result of this proposed legislation.
