**4. Title:** Distracted driving

**5. Summary:** Currently, it is a traffic infraction to text or read e-mail while driving. A first offense is punishable by a fine of \$125; for a second or subsequent offense, \$250. The proposed legislation would make any violation of the prohibition while driving in a highway work zone punishable by a mandatory fine of \$250.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** The bill imposes a mandatory fine of \$250 for using a handheld personal communications device for reading emails or texting while operating a motor vehicle in a highway work zone. All revenue from traffic fines is deposited into the Literary Fund, however, the amount of revenue that would be deposited into the Literary Fund cannot be determined at this time.
