4. Title: Teacher licensure; alternate routes.

5. Summary: Requires the Board of Education's regulations for alternate routes to teacher licensure to include eligibility for any individual to receive, notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, a renewable one-year license to teach in public high schools in the Commonwealth if he has (1) received a graduate degree from a regionally accredited institution of higher education, (2) completed at least 30 credit hours of teaching experience as an instructor at a regionally accredited institution of higher education, (3) received qualifying scores on the professional teacher's assessments prescribed by the Board, and (4) met the requirements set forth in § 22.1-298.1. subdivisions D 2 and 5.
