## 5. Summary/Purpose:

This bill would require the Department of Taxation ("the Department") and the Virginia Employment Commission ("VEC") to consider the feasibility of permitting taxpayers to submit tax reports and payments electronically for both VEC and the Department using a single sign-on. The Department and VEC would also be required to consider the feasibility, merits, and costs of developing and implementing an identity management system or retaining a contractor to do so.

#### **Administrative Costs**

The Department and VEC would be able to study the feasibility of modifying their systems without requiring an appropriation. If it is determined that the requested system modifications are feasible, an appropriation may be requested in the future.

The VEC website offers several methods for filing and paying electronically, as well as instructions for filing on paper. For several years, VEC has linked to the Department of Taxation's iFile and Web Upload functions. Recently, VEC has upgraded its systems, which includes online functions similar to those offered by the Department. VEC is planning to utilize its own electronic filing systems in the future.
