**4. Title:** Child day programs at public or private school facilities; exemptions.

**5. Summary:** Prohibits the Board of Social Services from adopting regulations governing child day programs located at public or private school facilities that prohibit children from using the outdoor play equipment and areas approved for use by students of the school during school hours. The bill also prohibits the board from adopting regulations governing child day programs located at public schools that require inspection or approval of the building, vehicles used to transport children attending the child day program that are owned by the school, or meals served to such children that are prepared by the school.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** This bill does not have a fiscal impact. The legislation reduces the Department of Social Services' legal authority, but it does not affect the total number of licensing inspectors.
