**4. Title: Sex Offender Registry**

**5. Summary:**

Current law requires that a person required to register with the Sex Offenders and Crimes Against Minors Registry who was convicted of certain crimes involving child pornography or carnal knowledge of a minor in juvenile custody under Virginia wait 25 years before being entitled to file a petition for removal of his name or information from the Registry. The proposed legislation would apply the same requirement to persons convicted of similar offenses under the laws of any foreign country, the United States, or a political subdivision of either.
