**3. Committee:** Education and Health

**4. Title:** Delivery of Schedule VI prescription devices.

**5. Summary:** Provides that a permitted manufacturer, wholesale distributor, warehouser, or third-party logistics provider or registered nonresident manufacturer or nonresident wholesale distributor may distribute Schedule VI prescription devices directly to a patient on behalf of a medical equipment supplier, provided that (i) such delivery occurs at the direction of a medical equipment supplier that has received a valid order for such controlled device for the patient from a prescriber and (ii) the manufacturer, nonresident manufacturer, wholesale distributor, nonresident wholesale distributor, warehouser, or third-party logistics provider has entered into an agreement with the medical equipment supplier for such delivery. The bill directs the Board of Pharmacy to promulgate emergency regulations to implement the provisions of the bill.
