- violent felony, this bill prohibits law enforcement, the attorney for the Commonwealth, counsel for a defendant, and the Department of Corrections from disclosing any telephone number or email address of the victim or witness unless such disclosure is required by law, necessary for law-enforcement purposes, or permitted by the court. The bill also provides that during any criminal proceeding, upon motion of the defendant or the attorney for the Commonwealth, a judge may prohibit testimony as to any telephone number or email address of a victim or witness if the judge determines that this information is not material under the circumstances of the case.

- **8. Fiscal Implications:** The proposed legislation provides that any telephone number or email address of a victim or witness are prohibited from being released under certain circumstances. The bill is not expected to have fiscal impact on state agencies.
