4. Title: Handheld photo speed monitoring devices

5. Summary: Permits the Department of State Police to operate handheld photo speed monitoring devices in order to aid in the determination of vehicle speed. The Department is also permitted to use these devices in highway work zones, so long as the device is used to record images of vehicles traveling at speeds of at least 12 miles per hour above the posted speed limit, highway workers are present, and the highway work zone is indicated to drivers by appropriately placed signs that display the maximum speed limit and inform them of the use of such devices.

The engrossed version of this bill provides that if a summons is issued by mail as a result of a VSP law enforcement officer using such a device, such offense shall not be used for insurance purposes by the driver's motor vehicle insurer. However, if a device is used, and a law enforcement officer thereafter personally issues a summons to the driver at the time of the violation, the conviction that results shall be made a part of the person's driving record and may be used for insurance purposes.
