- 5. Summary: Directs the Department of Labor and Industry (the Department) with the assistance of the Department of Education to determine the feasibility of implementing a Youth Employment Solutions (YES) apprenticeship program. Under a YES apprenticeship program, agencies of the Commonwealth enter into an agreement with a private staffing firm under which the firm provides services to an employer that result in the assumption by the private staffing firm of duties and responsibilities, with regard to apprentices, including duties and responsibilities arising with respect to the Virginia Workers' Compensation Act and insurance liability, that would otherwise apply to the employer. The measure directs the Department to (i) identify potential benefits and problems of implementing a YES apprenticeship program; (ii) determine whether one or more private staffing firms are willing to participate; and, (iii) ascertain whether existing law prevents implementation of a YES apprenticeship program and, if so, identify such law in a report to the chairs of the Senate Committee on Commerce and Labor, the Senate Committee on Education and Health, the House Committee on Commerce and Labor, and the House Committee on Education by October 1, 2018.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** It is anticipated that this bill will have a general fund expenditure impact on the Department of Labor and Industry and the Department of Education.

The Department of Labor and Industry (DOLI) estimates a cost of \$39,000 to pay a skilled contractor to help the agency meet the requirements of this bill. DOLI does not anticipate that its Registered Apprenticeship program has the availability and specific knowledge requirement to meet the requirements of this bill in the required timeframe. Very few potential sponsors have cited insurance costs as a reason for not taking on apprentices. In identifying the potential benefits and problems of implementing this program, DOLI anticipates conducting a study to know the position of current and potential sponsors on the issues.

The Department of Education (DOE) estimates a cost of \$30,000 to pay a skilled contractor to help the agency in assisting DOLI in determining the feasibility of implementing a YES apprenticeship program. Because the report is due October 1, 2018, DOE does not anticipate that its Career and Technical Education (CTE) staff has the availability and specific knowledge required to meet the requirements of this bill in that timeframe.

DOLI is directed to ascertain whether state or federal law prevents the agencies' implementation of a YES apprenticeship program in a report to the chairs of the Senate Committee on Commerce and Labor, the Senate Committee on Education and Health, the House Committee on Commerce and Labor, and the House Committee on Education by October 1, 2018.

The agencies may be able to coordinate on the use of a skilled contractor for this project.
