Each public high school shall provide to any enrolled student who is of voting age or is eligible to 14 register to vote pursuant to § 24.2-403 (i) mail voter registration applications and voter registration 15 information provided by the Department of Elections or (ii) access to the Virginia online voter 16 registration system on a school-owned computing device that is accessible to such student. The principal 17 of each public high school at which mail voter registration applications are provided shall ensure that 18 19 at least one school board employee who is employed at the high school is trained in maintaining and 20providing access to such applications. § 23.1-401.2. Public institutions of higher education; Virginia voter registration. 21 22 Each public institution of higher education shall provide to any enrolled student who is of voting age 23 or is eligible to register to vote pursuant to § 24.2-403 (i) mail voter registration applications and voter registration information provided by the Department of Elections or (ii) access to the Virginia online 24 25 voter registration system (a) on a school-owned computing device that is accessible to such student or 26 (b) through the institution's electronic course registration system. The chief executive officer of each

27 public institution of higher education at which mail voter registration applications are provided shall28 ensure that at least one employee of the institution is trained in maintaining and providing access to
