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11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That §§ 3-13 and 3-14, as amended, and §§ 3-15 and 3-16 of Chapter 259 of the Acts of
13	Assembly of 1962 are amended and reenacted as follows:
14	§ 3-13. Powers and duties of treasurer.
15	The city treasurer shall be the custodian of all moneys belonging to the city, shall deposit the same
16	in such bank or banks as the council shall prescribe, shall keep his office in some place designated by
17	the city council, shall keep his books and accounts in such manner as the city council may require,
18	which books and accounts shall always be open to the inspection of the mayor, and any member or
19 20	committee of the city council, city manager, and finance director or equivalent officer. He shall report to the city council at the end of each fiscal year, and more often, if required, a full and detailed account of
<b>20</b> <b>21</b>	all receipts and expenditures during that year and the state of the treasury. He shall keep as a separate
22	fund any special assessment, and the same shall only be used for the purpose for which it was raised.
23	He shall keep all city moneys separate and distinct from his own moneys, and he is prohibited from
24	using either directly or indirectly the corporation money in his custody and keeping, for his own use and
25	benefit or that of any other person or persons whomsoever and any violation of this provision shall
26	subject him to immediate removal from office collect and receive all moneys due the city from the State
27 28	and all taxes and levies due the State and collected within the city, and shall disburse the same, using
20 29	any procedure now or hereafter prescribed by law. In performing his duties, the city treasurer shall be entitled to employ such staff as the State Compensation Board authorizes.
<b>3</b> 0	§ 3-14. Collector of city taxes generally.
31	There may be appointed by the city council, in its discretion, a collector of city taxes who shall serve
32	at the pleasure of the city council. He shall perform such duties and have such powers as are prescribed
33	by the city council or by state law. The city manager shall serve as the collector of city taxes. If the
34	city council does not appoint a collector of city taxes, duties and powers prescribed to the collector of
35	city taxes shall be administered by the treasurer and as provided for by state law.
36 37	§ 3-15. Deputies of collector of <i>city</i> taxes. The collector of city taxes may appoint one or more deputies, <i>who shall have oversight of city</i>
37 38	<i>finances</i> , as may be provided by the city council, but the sureties in the bond of such officer shall be
39	equally liable for the acts of the deputies as for those of the principal.
40	§ 3-16. Powers and duties of collector of city taxes and collector of delinquent taxes.
41	The collector of city taxes shall be the custodian of all moneys belonging to the city; shall deposit
42	the same in such bank or banks as the council shall prescribe; shall keep his office in some place
43	designated by the city council; and shall keep his books and accounts in such manner as the city
44 45	council may require, which books and accounts shall always be open to the inspection of the mayor, any member or committee of the city council, and the finance director or equivalent officer. He shall
<b>4</b> 6	report to the city council at the end of each fiscal year, and more often if required, a full and detailed
47	account of all receipts and expenditures during that year and the state of the treasury. He shall keep as
48	a separate fund any special assessment, and the same shall only be used for the purpose for which it
49	was raised. The collector of city taxes shall collect all taxes and assessments which that may be levied
50	by the city, and perform such other duties as may be herein prescribed or ordained by the council. The
51	collector of city taxes shall keep his office at such place as shall be designated by the city council, and
52 53	shall keep in such office such books, vouchers, and accounts as the city council may direct and
53 54	prescribe, all of which shall be subject to the inspection and examination of the mayor, members of the council, and of any committee of the council. He shall make report in writing, under oath, to the city
54 55	treasurer weekly, or oftener, if required, as to the amount of all moneys collected by him, and shall pay
56	the same into the city treasury weekly. At the end of each fiscal year he shall submit to the council a
57	statement of all moneys collected by him during the year, and the particular assessment or account upon
58	which collected, also and a statement showing the amount uncollected.
