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1 VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER An Act to amend and reenact §§ 54.1-2400.1, 54.1-3500, and 54.1-3505 of the Code of Virginia, 2 3 relating to the Board of Counseling; qualified mental health professionals. [H 2693] 4 5 Approved 6 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That §§ 54.1-2400.1, 54.1-3500, and 54.1-3505 of the Code of Virginia are amended and 7 8 reenacted as follows: 9 § 54.1-2400.1. Mental health service providers; duty to protect third parties; immunity. 10 A. As used in this section: 11 "Certified substance abuse counselor" means a person certified to provide substance abuse counseling 12 in a state-approved public or private substance abuse program or facility. "Client" or "patient" means any person who is voluntarily or involuntarily receiving mental health services or substance abuse services from any mental health service provider. 13 14 15 "Clinical psychologist" means a person who practices clinical psychology as defined in § 54.1-3600. "Clinical social worker" means a person who practices social work as defined in § 54.1-3700. 16 "Licensed practical nurse" means a person licensed to practice practical nursing as defined in 17 18 § 54.1-3000. 19 "Licensed substance abuse treatment practitioner" means any person licensed to engage in the 20 practice of substance abuse treatment as defined in § 54.1-3500. 21 "Marriage and family therapist" means a person licensed to engage in the practice of marriage and 22 family therapy as defined in § 54.1-3500. 23 "Mental health professional" means a person who by education and experience is professionally qualified and licensed in Virginia to provide counseling interventions designed to facilitate an 24 25 individual's achievement of human development goals and remediate mental, emotional, or behavioral 26 disorders and associated distresses which interfere with mental health and development. 27 "Mental health service provider" or "provider" refers to any of the following: (i) a person who 28 provides professional services as a certified substance abuse counselor, clinical psychologist, clinical 29 social worker, licensed substance abuse treatment practitioner, licensed practical nurse, marriage and 30 family therapist, mental health professional, physician, physician assistant, professional counselor, 31 psychologist, qualified mental health professional, registered nurse, registered peer recovery specialist, 32 school psychologist, or social worker; (ii) a professional corporation, all of whose shareholders or 33 members are so licensed; or (iii) a partnership, all of whose partners are so licensed. 34 "Professional counselor" means a person who practices counseling as defined in § 54.1-3500. 35 "Psychologist" means a person who practices psychology as defined in § 54.1-3600. "Qualified mental health professional" means a person who by education and experience is professionally qualified and registered by the Board of Counseling to provide collaborative mental health 36 37 services for adults or children. A qualified mental health professional shall provide such services as an 38 39 employee or independent contractor of the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental 40 Services, the Department of Corrections, or a provider licensed by the Department of Behavioral Health 41 and Developmental Services has the same meaning as provided in § 54.1-3500. 42 "Registered nurse" means a person licensed to practice professional nursing as defined in 43 § 54.1-3000. "Registered peer recovery specialist" means a person who by education and experience is 44 professionally qualified and registered by the Board of Counseling to provide collaborative services to 45 assist individuals in achieving sustained recovery from the effects of addiction or mental illness, or both. 46 A registered peer recovery specialist shall provide such services as an employee or independent 47 contractor of the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services, a provider licensed by 48 49 the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services, a practitioner licensed by or holding 50 a permit issued from the Department of Health Professions, or a facility licensed by the Department of Health. 51 52 "School psychologist" means a person who practices school psychology as defined in § 54.1-3600. 53 "Social worker" means a person who practices social work as defined in § 54.1-3700. 54 B. A mental health service provider has a duty to take precautions to protect third parties from 55 violent behavior or other serious harm only when the client has orally, in writing, or via sign language, 56 communicated to the provider a specific and immediate threat to cause serious bodily injury or death to

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an identified or readily identifiable person or persons, if the provider reasonably believes, or should 57 believe according to the standards of his profession, that the client has the intent and ability to carry out 58 59 that threat immediately or imminently. If the third party is a child, in addition to taking precautions to protect the child from the behaviors in the above types of threats, the provider also has a duty to take 60 61 precautions to protect the child if the client threatens to engage in behaviors that would constitute physical abuse or sexual abuse as defined in § 18.2-67.10. The duty to protect does not attach unless the 62 threat has been communicated to the provider by the threatening client while the provider is engaged in 63 64 his professional duties.

C. The duty set forth in subsection B is discharged by a mental health service provider who takes 65 66 one or more of the following actions:

67 1. Seeks involuntary admission of the client under Article 16 (§ 16.1-335 et seq.) of Chapter 11 of 68 Title 16.1 or Chapter 8 (§ 37.2-800 et seq.) of Title 37.2.

69 2. Makes reasonable attempts to warn the potential victims or the parent or guardian of the potential 70 victim if the potential victim is under the age of 18.

71 3. Makes reasonable efforts to notify a law-enforcement official having jurisdiction in the client's or 72 potential victim's place of residence or place of work, or place of work of the parent or guardian if the 73 potential victim is under age 18, or both.

74 4. Takes steps reasonably available to the provider to prevent the client from using physical violence 75 or other means of harm to others until the appropriate law-enforcement agency can be summoned and 76 takes custody of the client.

77 5. Provides therapy or counseling to the client or patient in the session in which the threat has been 78 communicated until the mental health service provider reasonably believes that the client no longer has 79 the intent or the ability to carry out the threat.

80 6. In the case of a registered peer recovery specialist, or a qualified mental health professional who is not otherwise licensed by a health regulatory board at the Department of Health Professions, reports 81 immediately to a licensed mental health service provider to take one or more of the actions set forth in 82 83 this subsection. 84

D. A mental health service provider shall not be held civilly liable to any person for:

85 1. Breaching confidentiality with the limited purpose of protecting third parties by communicating the 86 threats described in subsection B made by his clients to potential third party victims or law-enforcement agencies or by taking any of the actions specified in subsection C. 87

88 2. Failing to predict, in the absence of a threat described in subsection B, that the client would cause 89 the third party serious physical harm.

90 3. Failing to take precautions other than those enumerated in subsection C to protect a potential third 91 party victim from the client's violent behavior. 92

§ 54.1-3500. Definitions.

As used in this chapter, unless the context requires a different meaning:

93 "Appraisal activities" means the exercise of professional judgment based on observations and objective assessments of a client's behavior to evaluate current functioning, diagnose, and select 94 95 appropriate treatment required to remediate identified problems or to make appropriate referrals. 96

97 "Board" means the Board of Counseling.

98 "Certified substance abuse counseling assistant" means a person certified by the Board to practice in 99 accordance with the provisions of § 54.1-3507.2.

"Certified substance abuse counselor" means a person certified by the Board to practice in 100 accordance with the provisions of § 54.1-3507.1. 101

102 "Counseling" means the application of principles, standards, and methods of the counseling 103 profession in (i) conducting assessments and diagnoses for the purpose of establishing treatment goals 104 and objectives and (ii) planning, implementing, and evaluating treatment plans using treatment interventions to facilitate human development and to identify and remediate mental, emotional, or 105 106 behavioral disorders and associated distresses that interfere with mental health.

107 "Licensed substance abuse treatment practitioner" means a person who: (i) is trained in and engages in the practice of substance abuse treatment with individuals or groups of individuals suffering from the 108 109 effects of substance abuse or dependence, and in the prevention of substance abuse or dependence; and 110 (ii) is licensed to provide advanced substance abuse treatment and independent, direct, and unsupervised treatment to such individuals or groups of individuals, and to plan, evaluate, supervise, and direct 111 substance abuse treatment provided by others. 112

"Marriage and family therapist" means a person trained in the appraisal and treatment of cognitive, 113 affective, or behavioral mental and emotional disorders within the context of marriage and family 114 115 systems through the application of therapeutic and family systems theories and techniques.

"Marriage and family therapy" means the appraisal and treatment of cognitive, affective, or behavioral mental and emotional disorders within the context of marriage and family systems through 116 117

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118 the application of therapeutic and family systems theories and techniques and delivery of services to 119 individuals, couples, and families, singularly or in groups, for the purpose of treating such disorders.

"Practice of counseling" means rendering or offering to render to individuals, groups, organizations,
 or the general public any service involving the application of principles, standards, and methods of the
 counseling profession, which shall include appraisal, counseling, and referral activities.

"Practice of marriage and family therapy" means the appraisal and treatment of cognitive, affective,
or behavioral mental and emotional disorders within the context of marriage and family systems through
the application of therapeutic and family systems theories and techniques, which shall include
assessment, treatment, and referral activities.

127 "Practice of substance abuse treatment" means rendering or offering to render substance abuse
 128 treatment to individuals, groups, organizations, or the general public.

"Professional counselor" means a person trained in the application of principles, standards, and
methods of the counseling profession, including counseling interventions designed to facilitate an
individual's achievement of human development goals and remediating mental, emotional, or behavioral
disorders and associated distresses that interfere with mental health and development.

133 "Qualified mental health professional" means a person who by education and experience is 134 professionally qualified and registered by the Board to provide collaborative mental health services for 135 adults or children. A qualified mental health professional shall provide such services as an employee or 136 independent contractor of the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services, the 137 Department of Corrections, or a provider licensed by the Department of Behavioral Health and 138 Developmental Services includes qualified mental health professionals-adult and qualified mental health 139 professionals-child.

140 "Qualified mental health professional-adult" means a qualified mental health professional who
141 provides collaborative mental health services for adults. A qualified mental health professional-adult
142 shall provide such services as an employee or independent contractor of the Department of Behavioral
143 Health and Developmental Services or the Department of Corrections, or as a provider licensed by the
144 Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services.

145 "Qualified mental health professional-child" means a person who by education and experience is
146 professionally qualified and registered by the Board to provide collaborative mental health services for
147 children and adolescents up to 22 years of age. A qualified mental health professional-child shall
148 provide such services as an employee or independent contractor of the Department of Behavioral Health
149 and Developmental Services or the Department of Corrections, or as a provider licensed by the
150 Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services.

151 "Qualified mental health professional-trainee" means a person who is receiving supervised training
 152 to qualify as a qualified mental health professional and is registered with the Board.

153 "Referral activities" means the evaluation of data to identify problems and to determine advisability154 of referral to other specialists.

155 "Registered peer recovery specialist" means a person who by education and experience is 156 professionally qualified and registered by the Board to provide collaborative services to assist individuals 157 in achieving sustained recovery from the effects of addiction or mental illness, or both. A registered peer 158 recovery specialist shall provide such services as an employee or independent contractor of the 159 Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services, a provider licensed by the Department of 160 Behavioral Health and Developmental Services, a practitioner licensed by or holding a permit issued 161 from the Department of Health Professions, or a facility licensed by the Department of Health.

162 "Residency" means a post-internship supervised clinical experience registered with the Board.

"Resident" means an individual who has submitted a supervisory contract to the Board and has
 received Board approval to provide clinical services in professional counseling under supervision.

165 "Substance abuse" and "substance dependence" mean a maladaptive pattern of substance use leading166 to clinically significant impairment or distress.

"Substance abuse treatment" means (i) the application of specific knowledge, skills, substance abuse treatment theory, and substance abuse treatment techniques to define goals and develop a treatment plan of action regarding substance abuse or dependence prevention, education, or treatment in the substance abuse or dependence recovery process and (ii) referrals to medical, social services, psychological, psychiatric, or legal resources when such referrals are indicated.

172 "Supervision" means the ongoing process, performed by a supervisor, of monitoring the performance
173 of the person supervised and providing regular, documented individual or group consultation, guidance,
174 and instruction with respect to the clinical skills and competencies of the person supervised.

175 § 54.1-3505. Specific powers and duties of the Board.

176 In addition to the powers granted in § 54.1-2400, the Board shall have the following specific powers 177 and duties:

178 1. To cooperate with and maintain a close liaison with other professional boards and the community

179 to ensure that regulatory systems stay abreast of community and professional needs.

180 2. To conduct inspections to ensure that licensees conduct their practices in a competent manner and 181 in conformance with the relevant regulations. 182

3. To designate specialties within the profession.

183 4. To administer the certification of rehabilitation providers pursuant to Article 2 (§ 54.1-3510 et 184 seq.) of this chapter, including prescribing fees for application processing, examinations, certification and

185 certification renewal. 186

187 6. To promulgate regulations for the qualifications, education, and experience for licensure of 188 marriage and family therapists. The requirements for clinical membership in the American Association 189 for Marriage and Family Therapy (AAMFT), and the professional examination service's national 190 marriage and family therapy examination may be considered by the Board in the promulgation of these 191 regulations. The educational credit hour, clinical experience hour, and clinical supervision hour 192 requirements for marriage and family therapists shall not be less than the educational credit hour, clinical experience hour, and clinical supervision hour requirements for professional counselors. 193

7. To promulgate, subject to the requirements of Article 1.1 (§ 54.1-3507 et seq.) of this chapter, 194 195 regulations for the qualifications, education, and experience for licensure of licensed substance abuse 196 treatment practitioners and certification of certified substance abuse counselors and certified substance 197 abuse counseling assistants. The requirements for membership in NAADAC: the Association for 198 Addiction Professionals and its national examination may be considered by the Board in the 199 promulgation of these regulations. The Board also may provide for the consideration and use of the 200 accreditation and examination services offered by the Substance Abuse Certification Alliance of Virginia. 201 The educational credit hour, clinical experience hour, and clinical supervision hour requirements for 202 licensed substance abuse treatment practitioners shall not be less than the educational credit hour, clinical experience hour, and clinical supervision hour requirements for licensed professional counselors. 203 204 Such regulations also shall establish standards and protocols for the clinical supervision of certified substance abuse counselors and the supervision or direction of certified substance abuse counseling 205 206 assistants, and reasonable access to the persons providing that supervision or direction in settings other 207 than a licensed facility.

208 8. To maintain a registry of persons who meet the requirements for supervision of residents. The 209 Board shall make the registry of approved supervisors available to persons seeking residence status.

210 9. To promulgate regulations for the registration of qualified mental health professionals, including 211 qualifications, education, and experience necessary for such registration, and for the registration of 212 persons receiving supervised training in order to qualify as a qualified mental health professional.

213 10. To promulgate regulations for the registration of peer recovery specialists who meet the 214 qualifications, education, and experience requirements established by regulations of the Board of 215 Behavioral Health and Developmental Services pursuant to § 37.2-203.
