That § 24.2-105 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted and that the Code of Virginia 11 is amended by adding in Article 6 of Chapter 1 of Title 24.2 a section numbered 24.2-124 as 12 13 follows: § 24.2-105. Prescribing various forms; language alternatives. 14 A. The State Board shall prescribe appropriate forms and records for the registration of voters, 15 conduct of elections, and implementation of this title, which shall be used throughout the 16 17 Commonwealth. 18 B. The State Board shall prescribe voting and election materials in languages other than English for 19 use by a county, city, or town that is subject to the requirements of § 24.2-124. For purposes of this 20 subsection, voting and election materials include registration or voting notices, forms, instructions, assistance, voter information pamphlets, ballots, sample ballots, candidate qualification information, and 21 notices regarding changes to local election districts, precincts, or polling places. Registration notices 22 23 include any notice of voter registration approval, denial, or cancellation, required by the provisions of 24 Chapter 4 (§ 24.2-400 et seq.) of this title. 25 § 24.2-124. Minority language accessibility; covered localities. A. The State Board shall designate a county, city, or town as a covered locality if it determines, in 26 27 consultation with the Director of the Census, based on the 2010 American Community Survey census 28 data and subsequent American Community Survey data in 5-year increments, or comparable census 29 data, that (i) either (a) more than five percent of the citizens of voting age of such county, city, or town 30 are members of a single language minority and are unable to speak or understand English adequately enough to participate in the electoral process, (b) more than 10,000 of the citizens of voting age of such 31 county, city, or town are members of a single language minority and are unable to speak or understand 32 33 English adequately enough to participate in the electoral process, or (c) in the case of a county, city, or 34 town containing all or any part of an Indian reservation, more than five percent of the American Indian 35 citizens of voting age within the Indian reservation are members of a single language minority and are unable to speak or understand English adequately enough to participate in the electoral process, and 36 37 (ii) the illiteracy rate of the citizens of the language minority as a group is higher than the national 38 illiteracy rate. 39 B. Whenever a covered locality provides any voting or election materials, it shall provide such 40 materials in the language of the applicable minority group as well as in the English language. For purposes of this requirement, voting and election materials include registration or voting notices, forms, 41 instructions, assistance, voter information pamphlets, ballots, sample ballots, candidate qualification 42 information, and notices regarding changes to local election districts, precincts, or polling places. 43 Registration notices include any notice of voter registration approval, denial, or cancellation, required 44 by the provisions of Chapter 4 (§ 24.2-400 et seq.) of this title. 45
