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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to direct the establishment of energy conservation measures providing incentives for the
 3 development of electric energy delivered from sunlight.

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Approved

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

7 1. § 1. Energy conservation measures providing incentives for the development of electric energy derived
 8 from sunlight.

9 A. Each Phase I and Phase II Utility, as such terms are defined in subdivision A 1 of § 56-585.1 of
10 the Code of Virginia, shall submit a petition for approval to design, implement and operate a three-year
11 program of energy conservation measures providing:

12 1. Incentives to low income, elderly and disabled individuals in an amount not to exceed \$25 million 13 in the aggregate for the installation of measures that reduce residential heating and cooling costs and enhance the health and safety of residents, including repairs and improvements to home heating and 14 15 cooling systems and installation of energy-saving measures in the house, such as insulation and air 16 sealing. In developing such incentive program, each utility shall utilize the stakeholder process set forth 17 in § 56-596.2 of the Virginia Code. The utility may provide such incentives directly to customers or to organizations that assist low income, elderly and disabled individuals. Such incentive program shall be 18 19 deemed to be a part of the \$140 million in energy efficiency programs that a Phase I utility is required 20 to develop pursuant to § 56-596.2 of the Virginia Code and a part of the \$870 million in energy efficiency programs that a Phase II utility is required to develop pursuant to § 56-596.2 of the Virginia 21 22 Code; provided that no portion of such incentive programs shall be deemed to be a part of the required 23 five percent of such energy conservation measures set aside for low income, elderly and disabled 24 individuals.

25 2. Incentives to low income, elderly and disabled individuals, who also participate in the incentive 26 program described above for the installation of measures that reduce residential heating and cooling 27 costs, in an amount not to exceed \$25 million in the aggregate for the installation of equipment to develop electric energy derived from sunlight. The utility may provide such incentives directly to 28 29 customers or to organizations that assist low income, elderly and disabled individuals. Such incentive 30 program shall not be deemed to be a part of the \$140 million in energy efficiency programs that a 31 Phase I utility is required to develop pursuant to § 56-596.2 of the Virginia Code nor a part of the \$870 million in energy efficiency programs that a Phase II utility is required to develop pursuant to 32 33 § 56-596.2 of the Virginia Code.

B. In developing such incentive programs, each utility shall give consideration to low income,
 elderly and disabled persons residing in housing that a redevelopment and housing authority owns or
 controls.

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
