4	Requesting the Virginia Department of Health to take action to increase awareness of shingles and
5	shingles prevention. Report.

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10	WHEREAS, herpes zoster, also known as shingles, is a disease caused by the same virus that causes
11	chickenpox, so any person who has contracted chickenpox during their lifetime is at risk for developing
12	shingles; and
12	WHEREAS, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), approximately 98
13 14	percent of adults in the United States are at risk for developing shingles, and nearly one in three people
14	in the United States will develop shingles in their lifetime, with shingles affecting more than one million
15 16	Americans each year; and
10	WHEDEAS a person's risk of developing shingles increases with age, nearly helf of individuals who
18	WHEREAS, a person's risk of developing shingles increases with age; nearly half of individuals who develop shingles are over 60 years of age and approximately half of people who reach 85 years of age
19 20	will develop shingles in their lifetime; and WHEREAS, according to the CDC, shingles is a viral infection that causes a painful,
<sup>20</sup> 21	sometimes-severe rash and other symptoms, including long-term nerve pain, fever, headache, chills,
<sup>21</sup> 22	upset stomach, muscle weakness, skin infection, scarring, and decreased or loss of vision or hearing; and
$\frac{22}{23}$	WHEREAS, as much as 20 percent of adults who have contracted shingles will develop postherpetic
23 24	neuralgia, a debilitating complication of shingles that causes severe pain, that may interfere with sleep
2 <del>4</del> 25	and recreational activities, and that may be associated with clinical depression; and
23 26	WHEREAS, vaccines have reduced the burden of widespread and often fatal diseases, enabling
20 27	individuals to lead longer and healthier lives while reducing health care costs; and
28	WHEREAS, although much attention has been paid to the importance of childhood vaccinations,
20 29	there is a general lack of awareness of adult-recommended vaccines and a misperception that
<b>3</b> 0	immunizations are unnecessary for healthy adults; and
31	WHEREAS, the CDC and the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) recommend
32	that healthy adults 50 years of age and older be vaccinated against shingles to prevent shingles and
33	shingles-related complications; and
34	WHEREAS, despite the recommendations of CDC officials and other experts, as of 2015 only 30
35	percent of eligible adults had received the shingles vaccine; and
36	WHEREAS, the annual economic burden of shingles in American adults is estimated to be between
37	\$782 million and \$5 billion; and
38	WHEREAS, the Institute of Medicine has stated that missed prevention opportunities is one of the
39	six key causes of excess spending in the U.S. health care system; and
40	WHEREAS, millions of American adults go without routine and recommended vaccinations because
41	our medical system is not set up to ensure that adults receive regular preventive health care; and
42	WHEREAS, during the month of August, which is is observed as National Immunization Awareness
43	Month, residents of Virginia should be encouraged to speak with their health care provider to ensure that
44	they have been properly vaccinated against shingles according to current CDC and ACIP
45	recommendations; now, therefore, be it
46	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Virginia Department of
47	Health be requested to take action to increase awareness of shingles and shingles prevention.
<b>48</b>	The Virginia Department of Health shall submit to the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an
<b>49</b>	executive summary and report of its progress in meeting the requests of this resolution no later than the
50	first day of the 2020 Regular Session of the General Assembly. The executive summary and report shall
51	be submitted for publication as a report document as provided in the procedures of the Division of
52	Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports and shall be
53	posted on the General Assembly's website.

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
