6	WHEREAS, the Honorable John Maston Davis, a respected attorney and a former judge of the 15th
7	Judicial District of Virginia, died on July 10, 2018; and
8	WHEREAS, John Davis attended Farnham High School, graduated from Randolph-Macon College
9	with a bachelor's degree in 1964, and earned his law degree from the University of Richmond in 1967;

11	WHEREAS, John Davis joined the United States Marine Corps and was assigned to Marine Corps
12	Base Quantico for two years; after his honorable military service, he continued to serve the public as an
13	assistant attorney for the Commonwealth in Newport News; and
14	WHEREAS, in 1972, John Davis joined the firm Ryland and Fidler in Warsaw and subsequently
15	became a partner in Ryland, Fidler and Davis; during this time, he also served as a substitute judge in
16	the area; and NULEDEAS in March 1005. Like Device any index for the 15th Ladicial District of
17	WHEREAS, in March 1995, John Davis was appointed as a judge for the 15th Judicial District of
18 19	Virginia's Juvenile and Domestic Relations District Court, serving the Counties of Essex, Lancaster,
19 20	Northumberland, Richmond, and Westmoreland; and WHEREAS, John Davis presided over the court with great fairness and wisdom until his well-earned
20 21	retirement from the bench in November 2008; throughout his long career, he served the Commonwealth
