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9	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
10	1. That § 46.2-888 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
11	§ 46.2-888. Stopping on highways; removing motor vehicle from roadway.
11 12 13 14	A. No person shall stop a vehicle in such manner as to impede or render dangerous the use of the
13	highway by others, except in the case of an emergency, an accident, or a mechanical breakdown.
1/	<i>B.</i> In the event of such an emergency, accident, or breakdown, the emergency flashing lights of such
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	vehicle shall be turned on if the vehicle is equipped with such lights and such lights are in working
16	order. If the driver is capable of safely doing so, the vehicle is movable, and there are no injuries or
17	deaths resulting from the emergency, accident, or breakdown, the driver shall move the vehicle from the
18	roadway to prevent obstructing the regular flow of traffic, provided, however, that the movement of the
19	vehicle to prevent the obstruction of traffic shall not relieve the law-enforcement officer of his duty
20	pursuant to § 46.2-373. A report of the vehicle's location shall be made to the nearest law-enforcement
21	officer as soon as practicable, and the vehicle shall be moved from the roadway to the shoulder as soon
22	as possible and removed from the shoulder without unnecessary delay. If the vehicle is not promptly
23	removed, such removal may be ordered by a law-enforcement officer at the expense of the owner if the
24	disabled vehicle creates a traffic hazard.
25	C. In the event of an accident on [any part of Interstate 66 where] a HOT lane as defined in

C. In the event of an accident on [any part of Interstate 66 where] a HOT lane as defined in 26 § 33.2-500 [that is] under construction [on Interstate 66] and the shoulders of [the HOT lane I-66] 27 are being or have been removed, the driver shall move the vehicle from the roadway to the nearest 28 pull-off area if the driver is capable of safely doing so, the vehicle is movable, and there are no injuries 29 or deaths resulting from the accident, provided, however, that the movement of the vehicle shall not 30 relieve the law-enforcement officer of his duty pursuant to § 46.2-373. For purposes of this subsection, "pull-off area" includes an exit ramp or otherwise agreed-upon location. A violation of this subsection is 31 a traffic infraction punishable by a fine of \$20. 32 33

2. That the provisions of this act shall expire upon the certification by the Secretary of Transportation that the HOT lane construction on Interstate 66 is complete. 34
