9	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:		
10		1. That § 10.1-2211.2 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:	
11	§ 10.1-2211.2. Disbursement of funds appropriated for caring for historical African American		
12		cemeteries and graves.	
13	A. For purposes of this section:		
14	"Historical African American cemetery" means a cemetery that was	s established prior to January 1,	
15	1900, for interments of African Americans.	1 5 7	
16		"Qualified organization" means a charitable corporation, charitable association, or charitable trust that	
17	has been granted tax-exempt status under § 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and whose primary		
18	purpose is the preservation of historical cemeteries and graves or any person or locality that owns a		
19	historical African American cemetery.		
20	B. At the direction of the Director, the Comptroller of the Commonwealth shall draw an annual		
21	warrant upon the State Treasurer from any sum that may be provided in the general appropriation act in		
22	favor of the treasurer of a qualified organization caring for any cemetery set forth in this subsection.		
23	Such appropriations shall be allocated on the basis of the number of graves, monuments, and markers in		
24	a cemetery of African Americans who lived at any time between January 1, 1800, and January 1, 1900,		
25	the dates to be determined by reference to grave markers or, at the discretion of the Director, other		
26	historical records. Such number of graves, monuments, and markers, as set forth opposite the cemetery		
27	name or as documented by the qualified organization, shall be multiplied by the rate of \$5 or the		
28	average actual cost of routine maintenance of a grave, monument, or marker, whichever is greater, to		
29	determine the amount of the allocation. The Department shall determine the average actual cost of		
30	routine maintenance of a grave, monument, or marker in a biennial survey of at least four properly		
31	maintained cemeteries, each located in a different geographical region of

An organization receiving funds shall expend the funds for the routine maintenance of its 53 historical African American cemetery and its graves and the erection of and caring for markers, 54 memorials, and monuments to the memory of such African Americans.

55 D. Each qualified organization, through its proper officer, shall after July 1 of each year submit to 56 the Director a certified statement that the funds appropriated to the organization during the preceding 57 fiscal year were or will be expended for the purposes set forth in subsection C. No organization that 58 fails to comply with any of the requirements of this section shall receive moneys allocated under this 59 section for any subsequent fiscal year until the organization fully complies with the requirements.

60 E. In addition to funds that may be provided pursuant to subsection B, any organization set forth in

subsection B may apply to the Director for a grant to perform extraordinary maintenance, renovation,
repair, or reconstruction of any of its historical African American cemeteries and graves. Such a grant
shall be made from any appropriation made available by the General Assembly for such purpose.

F. Any locality may receive and hold funds drawn pursuant to subsection B on behalf of any qualified organization until such time as the organization is able to receive or utilize such funds. No local matching funds shall be required for any grants made pursuant to this section.

67 G. The owner of a historical African American cemetery shall reasonably cooperate with a qualified 68 organization that receives funds pursuant to subsection B.
