3	(Proposed by the Senate Committee on Transportation
4 5	on January 16, 2019) (Patrons Prior to Substitute – Sonators Stuart and Poovos [SP 1228])
5 6	(Patrons Prior to Substitute—Senators Stuart and Reeves [SB 1338]) A BILL to amend and reenact § 33.2-613 of the Code of Virginia, relating to free use of toll facilities;
7	emergency medical services vehicles.
8	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
9	1. That § 33.2-613 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
10	§ 33.2-613. Free use of toll facilities by certain state officers and employees; penalties.
11	A. Upon presentation of a toll pass issued pursuant to regulations promulgated by the Board, the
12 13	following persons may use all toll bridges, toll ferries, toll tunnels, and toll roads in the Commonwealth without the payment of toll while in the performance of their official duties:
13	1. The Commissioner of Highways;
15	2. Members of the Commonwealth Transportation Board;
16	3. Employees of the Department of Transportation;
17	4. The Superintendent of the Department of State Police;
18	5. Officers and employees of the Department of State Police;
19 20	6. Members of the Board of Directors of the Virginia Alcoholic Beverage Control Authority;7. Employees of the regulatory and hearings divisions of the Virginia Alcoholic Beverage Control
20 21	Authority and special agents of the Virginia Alcoholic Beverage Control Authority;
22	8. The Commissioner of the Department of Motor Vehicles;
23	9. Employees of the Department of Motor Vehicles;
24	10. Local police officers;
25	11. Sheriffs and their deputies;
26 27	12. Regional jail officials; 13. Animal wardens;
28	14. The Director and officers of the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries;
29	15. Persons operating firefighting equipment and emergency medical services vehicles owned by a
30	political subdivision of the Commonwealth or a nonprofit association or corporation as defined in
31	§ 32.1-111.1;
32 33	16. Operators of school buses being used to transport pupils to or from schools; 17. Operators of (i) commuter buses having a capacity of 20 or more passengers, including the
34	driver, and used to regularly transport workers to and from their places of employment and (ii) public
35	transit buses;
36	18. Employees of the Department of Rail and Public Transportation;
37	19. Employees of any transportation facility created pursuant to the Virginia Highway Corporation
38 39	Act of 1988; and 20. Law-enforcement officers of the Virginia Marine Resources Commission.
40	B. Notwithstanding the provision of subsection A requiring presentation of a toll pass for toll-free
41	use of such facilities, in cases of emergency and circumstances of concern for public safety on the
42	highways of the Commonwealth, the Department of Transportation shall, in order to alleviate an actual
43	or potential threat or risk to the public's safety, facilitate the flow of traffic on or within the vicinity of
44 45	the toll facility by permitting the temporary suspension of toll collection operations on its facilities. 1. The assessment of the threat to public safety shall be performed and the decision temporarily to
43 46	suspend toll collection operations shall be made by the Commissioner of Highways or his designee.
47	2. Major incidents that may require the temporary suspension of toll collection operations shall
48	include (i) natural disasters such as hurricanes, tornadoes, fires, and floods; (ii) accidental releases of
49	hazardous materials such as chemical spills; (iii) major traffic accidents, such as multivehicle collisions;
50 51	and (iv) other incidents deemed to present a risk to public safety.
51 52	3. In any judicial proceeding in which a person is found to be criminally responsible or civilly liable for any incident resulting in the suspension of toll collections as provided in this subsection, the court
52 53	may assess against the person an amount equal to lost toll revenue as a part of the costs of the
54	proceeding and order that such amount, not to exceed \$2,000 for any individual incident, be paid to the
55	Department of Transportation for deposit into the toll road fund.
56	C. Any tollgate keeper who refuses to permit the persons listed in subsection A to use any toll
57 58	bridge, toll ferry, toll tunnel, or toll road upon presentation of such a toll pass is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than \$50 and not less than \$2.50. Any person other than
58 59	those listed in subsection A who exhibits any such toll pass for the purpose of using any toll bridge, toll

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60 ferry, toll tunnel, or toll road is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.

D. Any vehicle operated by the holder of a valid driver's license issued by the Commonwealth or 61 62 any other state shall be allowed free use of all toll bridges, toll roads, and other toll facilities in the 63 Commonwealth if:

1. The vehicle is specially equipped to permit its operation by a handicapped person;

65 2. The driver of the vehicle has been certified, either by a physician licensed by the Commonwealth or any other state or by the Adjudication Office of the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, as being 66 severely physically disabled and having permanent upper limb mobility or dexterity impairments that 67 68 substantially impair his ability to deposit coins in toll baskets;

3. The driver has applied for and received from the Department of Transportation a vehicle window 69 70 sticker identifying him as eligible for such free passage; and 71

4. Such identifying window sticker is properly displayed on the vehicle.

72 A copy of this subsection shall be posted at all toll bridges, toll roads, and other toll facilities in the Commonwealth. The Department of Transportation shall provide envelopes for payments of tolls by 73 74 those persons exempted from tolls pursuant to this subsection and shall accept any payments made by 75 such persons.

E. Nothing contained in this section or in § 33.2-612 or 33.2-1718 shall operate to affect the 76 77 provisions of \S 22.1-187.

78 F. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsections A, B, and C, only the following persons may use 79 the Chesapeake Bay Bridge-Tunnel, facilities of the Richmond Metropolitan Transportation Authority, or 80 facilities of an operator authorized to operate a toll facility pursuant to the Public-Private Transportation Act of 1995 (§ 33.2-1800 et seq.) without the payment of toll when necessary and incidental to the 81 conduct of official business: 82

1. The Commissioner of Highways: 83

2. Members of the Commonwealth Transportation Board; 84

85 3. Employees of the Department of Transportation;

86 4. The Superintendent of the Department of State Police;

87 5. Officers and employees of the Department of State Police;

88 6. The Commissioner of the Department of Motor Vehicles;

89 7. Employees of the Department of Motor Vehicles; and

90 8. Sheriffs and deputy sheriffs.

91 G. Any vehicle operated by a quadriplegic driver shall be allowed free use of all toll facilities in 92 Virginia controlled by the Richmond Metropolitan Transportation Authority, pursuant to the requirements 93 of subdivisions D 1 through 4.

94 H. Vehicles transporting two or more persons, including the driver, may be permitted toll-free use of the Dulles Toll Road during rush hours by the Board; however, notwithstanding the provisions of 95 96 subdivision B 1 of § 56-543, said such vehicles shall not be permitted toll-free use of a roadway as

defined pursuant to the Virginia Highway Corporation Act of 1988 (§ 56-535 et seq.). 97
