AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE (Proposed by the Senate Committee on Education and Health

on January 31, 2019)

(Patrons Prior to Substitute—Senators Newman and Lewis [SB 1563])

- 5 A BILL to amend and reenact § 9.1-184 of the Code of Virginia and to amend the Code of Virginia by 6 adding a section numbered 22.1-280.2.3, relating to school boards; local law-enforcement agencies; 7 8 memorandums of understanding.
- Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: Q

1. That § 9.1-184 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted and that the Code of Virginia 10 11 is amended by adding a section numbered 22.1-280.2:3 as follows:

§ 9.1-184. Virginia Center for School and Campus Safety created; duties.

A. From such funds as may be appropriated, the Virginia Center for School and Campus Safety (the 13 14 Center) is hereby established within the Department. The Center shall:

15 1. Provide training for Virginia public school personnel in school safety, on evidence-based antibullying tactics based on the definition of bullying in § 22.1-276.01, and in the effective 16 17 identification of students who may be at risk for violent behavior and in need of special services or 18 assistance:

2. Serve as a resource and referral center for Virginia school divisions by conducting research, 19 20 sponsoring workshops, and providing information regarding current school safety concerns, such as 21 conflict management and peer mediation, bullying as defined in § 22.1-276.01, school facility design and 22 technology, current state and federal statutory and regulatory school safety requirements, and legal and 23 constitutional issues regarding school safety and individual rights;

24 3. Maintain and disseminate information to local school divisions on effective school safety 25 initiatives in Virginia and across the nation;

26 4. Collect, analyze, and disseminate various Virginia school safety data, including school safety audit 27 information submitted to it pursuant to § 22.1-279.8, collected by the Department;

28 5. Encourage the development of partnerships between the public and private sectors to promote 29 school safety in Virginia;

30 6. Provide technical assistance to Virginia school divisions in the development and implementation of 31 initiatives promoting school safety, including threat assessment-based protocols with such funds as may 32 be available for such purpose;

33 7. Develop a memorandum of understanding between the Director of the Department of Criminal 34 Justice Services and the Superintendent of Public Instruction to ensure collaboration and coordination of 35 roles and responsibilities in areas of mutual concern, such as school safety audits and crime prevention; 8. Provide training for and certification of school security officers, as defined in § 9.1-101 and

36 37 consistent with § 9.1-110; 38

9. Develop, in conjunction with the Department of State Police, the Department of Behavioral Health 39 and Developmental Services, and the Department of Education, a model critical incident response 40 training program for public school personnel and others providing services to schools that shall also be 41 made available to private schools in the Commonwealth; and

42 10. In consultation with the Department of Education, provide schools with a model policy for the 43 establishment of threat assessment teams, including procedures for the assessment of and intervention with students whose behavior poses a threat to the safety of school staff or students; and 44

11. Develop a model memorandum of understanding setting forth the respective roles and 45 responsibilities of local school boards and local law-enforcement agencies regarding the use of school 46 47 resource officers. Such model memorandum of understanding may be used by local school boards and local law-enforcement agencies to satisfy the requirements of § 22.1-280.2:3. **48**

49 B. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall cooperate with the Center and, upon request, assist the 50 Center in the performance of its duties and responsibilities. 51

§ 22.1-280.2:3. School boards; local law-enforcement agencies; memorandums of understanding.

The school board in each school division in which the local law-enforcement agency employs school 52 53 resource officers, as defined in § 9.1-101, shall enter into a memorandum of understanding with such 54 local law-enforcement agency that sets forth the powers and duties of such school resource officers. The provisions of such memorandum of understanding shall be consistent with the model memorandum of 55 understanding developed by the Virginia Center for School and Campus Safety pursuant to subdivision 56 A 11 of § 9.1-184. Each such school board and local law-enforcement agency shall review and amend 57 or affirm such memorandum at least once every five years or at any time upon the request of either 58 59 party.

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
