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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact § 30-133 of the Code of Virginia, relating to Auditor of Public Accounts; 3 Commonwealth Data Point; employee compensation information.

Approved

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

8 1. That § 30-133 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 9

§ 30-133. Duties and powers generally.

10 A. The Auditor of Public Accounts shall audit all the accounts of every state department, officer, board, commission, institution, or other agency handling any state funds as determined necessary by the 11 Auditor of Public Accounts. In the performance of such duties and the exercise of such powers he may 12 13 employ the services of certified public accountants, provided the cost thereof shall not exceed such sums 14 as may be available out of the appropriation provided by law for the conduct of his office.

15 B. The Auditor of Public Accounts shall review the information required in § 2.2-1501 to determine that state agencies are providing and reporting appropriate information on financial and performance 16 measures, and the Auditor shall review the accuracy of the management systems used to accumulate and 17 18 report the results. The Auditor shall report to the General Assembly the results of such audits and make 19 recommendations, if indicated, for new or revised accountability or performance measures to be 20 implemented for the agencies audited.

C. The Auditor of Public Accounts shall prepare, by November 1, a summary of the results of all of 21 22 the audits and other oversight responsibilities performed for the most recently ended fiscal year. The Auditor of Public Accounts shall present this summary to the Senate Finance, House Appropriations, and 23 24 House Finance Committees on the day the Governor presents to the General Assembly the Executive Budget in accordance with §§ 2.2-1508 and 2.2-1509 or at the direction of the respective Chairman of 25 26 the Senate Finance, House Appropriations, or House Finance Committees at one of their committee 27 meetings prior to the meeting above.

28 D. As part of his normal oversight responsibilities, the Auditor of Public Accounts shall incorporate 29 into his audit procedures and processes a review process to ensure that the Commonwealth's payments to 30 counties, cities, and towns under Chapter 35.1 (§ 58.1-3523 et seq.) of Title 58.1 are consistent with the provisions of § 58.1-3524. The Auditor of Public Accounts shall report to the Governor and the 31 32 Chairman of the Senate Finance Committee annually any material failure by a locality or the 33 Commonwealth to comply with the provisions of Chapter 35.1 of Title 58.1.

34 E. The Auditor of Public Accounts when called upon by the Governor shall examine the accounts of 35 any institution maintained in whole or in part by the Commonwealth and, upon the direction of the Comptroller, shall examine the accounts of any officer required to settle his accounts with him; and 36 37 upon the direction of any other state officer at the seat of government he shall examine the accounts of any person required to settle his accounts with such officer. 38

39 F. Upon the written request of any member of the General Assembly, the Auditor of Public Accounts 40 shall furnish the requested information and provide technical assistance upon any matter requested by 41 such member.

42 G. In compliance with the provisions of the federal Single Audit Act Amendments of 1996, Public 43 Law 104-156, the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission may authorize the Auditor of Public 44 Accounts to audit biennially the accounts pertaining to federal funds received by state departments, 45 officers, boards, commissions, institutions, or other agencies.

46 H. 1. The Auditor of Public Accounts shall compile and maintain on its Internet website a searchable 47 database providing certain state expenditure, revenue, and demographic information as described in this subsection. In maintaining the database, the Auditor of Public Accounts shall work with and coordinate 48 his efforts with the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission in obtaining, summarizing, and compiling the information to avoid duplication of efforts. The database shall be updated each year by 49 50 October 15 to provide the information required in this subsection for the 10 most recently ended fiscal 51 52 years of the Commonwealth.

53 The online database shall be made available to citizens of the Commonwealth to allow public access 54 to historical revenue collections and appropriations with related demographic information, to the extent 55 that the information is available and provided to the Auditor of Public Accounts. All state departments, courts officers, boards, commissions, institutions, or other agencies of the Commonwealth shall furnish 56 57 all information requested by the Auditor of Public Accounts and shall cooperate with him to the fullest **SB1556ER**

58 extent.

59 For purposes of reporting information and implementing the database pursuant to this subsection, the 60 Auditor of Public Accounts shall include all appropriated funds and other sources under the control of public institutions of higher education, except for the activity of private gifts, including endowment 61 62 funds and unrestricted gifts referenced in § 23.1-101. The exclusion of this activity does not affect the 63 public access to these records unless otherwise specifically exempted by law.

2. The database shall contain the following for each of the 10 most recently ended fiscal years of the 64 65 Commonwealth:

66 a. Major categories of spending by each secretariat and each agency and institution, including each 67 independent agency, and including within each major category a register of all funds expended, showing 68 vendor name, date of payment, amount, and a description of the type of expense, including credit card 69 purchases with the same information to the extent that the information exists. The database shall include 70 the name, phone number, and email address for a contact at the agency or institution who may be 71 contacted for additional information;

72 b. (Effective until July 1, 2019) The number of full-time state employees and a listing of the 73 positions and salary of each such position, organized by agency;

74 b. (Effective July 1, 2019) The number of full-time state employees and a listing of the positions for 75 whom the annual rate of pay is more than \$10,000, an identifier associated with each such employee, 76 and the actual salary, bonuses, and total compensation of each such position, and the identifier associated with each position for which the annual rate of pay is more than \$10,000 paid during the 77 78 fiscal year to the employee associated with each identifier, organized by agency;

79 c. Total fiscal year revenues from state taxes, fees, and other charges, and total fiscal year revenues 80 from state taxes, fees, and other charges computed on a per capita basis and as a percentage of personal income in the Commonwealth; 81

82 d. With regard to state taxes, fees, and other charges computed on a per capita basis and as a 83 percentage of personal income, a comparison of such statistics for Virginia with the same statistics for 84 other states;

85 e. Total fiscal year revenues from federal sources, including the major categories of spending for 86 such revenues;

87 f. Total population and total population by various age groups including, but not limited to, 88 school-age population and the population of persons 65 years of age and older;

89 g. Student enrollment in grades K through 12;

90 h. Enrollment in public institutions of higher education of the Commonwealth;

91 i. Enrollment in private institutions of higher education in the Commonwealth;

- 92 j. The annual prison population;
- 93 k. Virginia adjusted gross income and Virginia taxable income by various age groups;
- 94 1. The number of citizens in the Commonwealth receiving food stamps;
- 95 m. The number of driver's licenses issued;
- 96 n. The number of registered motor vehicles;
- 97 o. The number of full-time private sector employees;
- 98 p. The number of households;

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- 99 q. The number of prepaid tuition contracts outstanding pursuant to Chapter 7 (§ 23.1-700 et seq.) of 100 Title 23.1 and the estimated total liability under such contracts;
- 101 r. Any state audit or report relating to the programs or activities of an agency;

102 s. Information on capital outlay payments including, but not limited to, project title, funding date, 103 completion date, appropriations, year-to-date expenditures, and unexpended appropriations;

104 t. Annual bonded indebtedness that shall include, but not be limited to, the amount of the total 105 original obligation stated in terms of principal and interest, the term of the obligation, the amounts of principal and interest previously paid to reduce the obligation, the balance remaining of the obligation, 106 107 and any refinancing of the obligation; and

u. Other data as the Auditor deems appropriate relating to the Commonwealth of Virginia.

3. The Auditor of Public Accounts shall incorporate into the database the following additional 109 110 elements as they become available through improved enterprise applications or other systems:

a. Commodities including, but not limited to, line item expenditures; 111

- b. Virginia Performs data as it directly relates to funding actions or expenditures; 112
- 113 c. Descriptive purpose for funding action or expenditure;
- d. Statute or act of General Assembly authorizing the issuance of bonds; and 114
- 115 e. Copies of actual grants and contracts.
- 116 4. The Auditor of Public Accounts shall incorporate in the database the following enhancements:
- 117 a. Graphs, charts, or other visual displays of aggregated data showing (i) current state spending by

expense category, (ii) year-to-year state spending, and (iii) other data deemed appropriate by the Auditor, 118

- 119 including display of available line item expenditures; and
- 120 b. Frequently asked questions and their responses.

5. By October 15 of each year, the Auditor shall also produce a paper copy or a computer file
containing the information described in this subsection and shall distribute the copy or file to
newspapers of general circulation in the Commonwealth. The distribution shall include the address of the
Internet website for the searchable database.

I. As a part of audits conducted pursuant to subsection A, the Auditor of Public Accounts shall
 review compliance with requirements established pursuant to the provisions of § 2.2-519 and the
 requirements of the Virginia Debt Collection Act (§ 2.2-4800 et seq.).
