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## **SENATE BILL NO. 1575**

AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE (Proposed by the Senate Committee on Education and Health)

(Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Ebbin)

4 5 6 Senate Amendments in [] — February 4, 2019 A BILL to amend § 22.1-305.2 of the Code of Virginia and to amend the Code of Virginia by adding a 7 section numbered 22.1-299.7, relating to teacher licensure; Advisory Board on Teacher Education 8 and Licensure; certain instructors at institutions of higher education.

9 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That § 22.1-305.2 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted and that the Code of 10 11 Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 22.1-299.7 as follows:

 $\S$  22.1-299.7. Certain instructors at institutions of higher education; three-year licenses. 12

Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the Board shall provide for the issuance of a 13 14 three-year license to solely teach career and technical education courses or dual enrollment courses at 15 public high schools in the Commonwealth to any individual who (i) is employed as an instructor by an institution of higher education that is accredited by a nationally recognized regional accreditation body, 16 17 (ii) is teaching in the specific career and technical education [or dual enrollment] subject area at such institution in which the individual seeks to teach at a public school, and (iii) complies with the 18 requirements set forth in subdivisions D 1 and 3 of § 22.1-298.1. The Board shall require any such 19 20 instructor to maintain continuous employment in such position at the institution of higher education as a 21 condition of continued licensure. 22

## § 22.1-305.2. Advisory Board on Teacher Education and Licensure.

23 There is hereby established the Advisory Board on Teacher Education and Licensure (the Advisory 24 *Board*), which shall consist of three legislative members to be appointed as follows: Two two members of the House of Delegates to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates, one member of 25 the Senate to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules, and 21 nonlegislative citizen members to 26 27 be appointed by the Board of Education. Ten nonlegislative citizen members of the Advisory Board 28 shall be classroom teachers, with at least the following representation: three elementary school teachers, 29 three middle school teachers, and three high school teachers. Three nonlegislative citizen members of the 30 Advisory Board shall be school administrators, one of whom shall be a school principal, one of whom shall be a division superintendent, and one of whom shall be a school personnel administrator. Four 31 32 nonlegislative citizen members of the Advisory Board shall be faculty members in teacher preparation 33 programs in public or private institutions of higher education, who may represent the arts and sciences. 34 One nonlegislative citizen member of the Advisory Board shall be a member of a school board. One 35 nonlegislative citizen member of the Advisory Board shall be a member of a parent-teacher association. 36 One nonlegislative citizen member of the Advisory Board shall be a representative of the business 37 community, and one nonlegislative citizen member shall be a citizen at large. The Chancellor of the 38 Virginia Community College or his designee shall serve as an ex officio member of the Advisory Board. 39 The Superintendent of Public Instruction or his designee and the Director of the State Council of Higher 40 Education for Virginia or his designee and the Chancellor of the Virginia Community College System or 41 his designee shall serve as nonvoting ex officio members of the Advisory Board.

42 The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall designate a staff liaison to coordinate the activities of 43 the Advisory Board. The Advisory Board shall meet five times per year or upon the request of its 44 chairman or the Board of Education. The Advisory Board shall annually elect a chairman from its membership. Nonlegislative citizen members are not entitled to compensation for their services. 45 Legislative members of the Advisory Board shall be compensated as provided in § 30-19.12. All 46 47 members shall be reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as members of the Advisory Board as provided in §§ 2.2-2813 and 2.2-2825. The funding **48** 49 for the costs of compensation and expenses of the members shall be provided by the Department of 50 Education.

51 The nonlegislative citizen members of the Advisory Board shall be appointed for three-year terms. Legislative members shall serve terms coincident with their terms of office. No person may be appointed 52 53 to serve for more than two consecutive terms. Members shall hold office after expiration of their terms 54 until their successors are duly appointed. Appointments to fill vacancies of members, other than by expiration of a term, shall be for the unexpired terms. Such vacancies shall be filled in the same manner 55 56 as the original appointments.

The Advisory Board on Teacher Education and Licensure shall advise the Board of Education and 57 submit recommendations on policies applicable to the qualifications, examination, licensure, and 58 59 regulation of school personnel including revocation, suspension, denial, cancellation, reinstatement, and

renewals of licensure, fees for processing applications, standards for the approval of preparation
programs, reciprocal approval of preparation programs, and other related matters as the Board of
Education may request or the Advisory Board may deem necessary. The final authority for licensure of

63 school personnel shall remain with the Board of Education.

64 2. That the provisions of the first enactment of this act that amend § 22.1-299.7 of the Code of

55 Virginia shall expire on July 1, 2021. However, any license issued pursuant to this act prior to 566 July 1, 2021 shall remain in effect for three years from the date it was issued unless such license

67 has been revoked by the Board of Education.

68 3. That the Advisory Board on Teacher Education and Licensure (the Advisory Board) shall make 69 recommendations relating to licensure qualifications for individuals (i) employed by an institution

70 of higher education to teach career and technical education courses in a high school setting and

(ii) to teach dual enrollment courses in a high school setting. In making its recommendations, the Advisory Board shall consider the plan, process, and criteria developed by the State Board for

72 Advisory Board shall consider the plan, process, and criteria developed by the State Board for 73 Community Colleges pursuant to subdivision 7 of § 23.1-2904 of the Code of Virginia and criteria
