That § 46.2-1095 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 10 § 46.2-1095. Child restraint devices required when transporting certain children; safety belts for 11 passengers less than 18 years old required. 12 A. (Effective until July 1, 2019) Any person who drives on the highways of Virginia any motor 13 vehicle manufactured after January 1, 1968, shall ensure that any child, up to age eight, whom he 14 15 transports therein is provided with and properly secured in a child restraint device of a type which meets the standards adopted by the United States Department of Transportation. Further, rear-facing child 16 restraint devices shall be placed in the back seat of a vehicle. In the event the vehicle does not have a 17 back seat, the child restraint device may be placed in the front passenger seat only if the vehicle is 18 19 either not equipped with a passenger side airbag or the passenger side airbag has been deactivated. A. (Effective July 1, 2019) Any person who drives on the highways of Virginia any motor vehicle manufactured after January 1, 1968, shall ensure that any child, up to age eight, whom he transports 20 21 therein is provided with and properly secured in a child restraint device of a type which meets the 22 23 standards adopted by the United States Department of Transportation. Such child restraint device shall 24 not be forward-facing until at least (i) the child reaches two years of age or (ii) the child reaches the 25 minimum weight limit for a forward-facing child restraint device as prescribed by the manufacturer of the device. Further, child restraint devices shall be placed in the back seat of a vehicle. In the event the 26 27 vehicle does not have a back seat, the child restraint device may be placed in the front passenger seat

28 only if the vehicle is either not equipped with a passenger side airbag or the passenger side airbag has 29 been deactivated. 30 B. Any person transporting another person less than 18 years old, except for those required pursuant 31 to subsection A to be secured in a child restraint device, shall ensure that such person is provided with

and properly secured by an appropriate safety belt system when driving on the highways of Virginia in any motor vehicle manufactured after January 1, 1968, equipped or required by the provisions of this 33 title to be equipped with a safety belt system, consisting of lap belts, shoulder harnesses, combinations 34 35 thereof or similar devices.

36 C. A violation of this section shall not constitute negligence, be considered in mitigation of damages 37 of whatever nature, be admissible in evidence or be the subject of comment by counsel in any action for 38 the recovery of damages in a civil action. 39

D. A violation of this section may be charged on the uniform traffic summons form.

Nothing in this section shall apply to [any persons operating (i)] taxicabs, school buses, 41 executive sedans, [or or] limousines [, or (ii)] emergency medical services agency vehicles, fire company vehicles, fire department vehicles, or law-enforcement agency vehicles [while in the 42 performance of their official duties, under exigent circumstances, provided that no child restraint device 43 is readily available]. 44
