## **SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 470**

Commending the Mount Vernon Council of Citizens' Associations.

6 WHEREAS, the Mount Vernon Council of Citizens' Associations, a nonpartisan, nonprofit
7 organization of citizens' associations in the Mount Vernon District of Fairfax County, celebrates its 50th
8 anniversary of service to the community in 2019; and

9 WHEREAS, established in 1969, the Mount Vernon Council of Citizens' Associations is the oldest
 and largest such council in Fairfax County; it is composed of 44 civic associations, community
 associations, property owners' associations, homeowners' associations, and condominium unit owners'
 associations; and

WHEREAS, the Mount Vernon Council of Citizens' Associations represents and promotes the
interests of its member organizations and provides a forum for residents and groups to address concerns
about land use, transportation, the environment, public safety, education, and housing; the council has
also built strong partnerships with government agencies to address issues in a timely and effective
manner; and

18 WHEREAS, the Mount Vernon Council of Citizens' Associations collaborated with the Department
 19 of Public Works to address property flooding due to new developments and increase transparency in the
 20 zoning process; and

WHEREAS, the Mount Vernon Council of Citizens' Associations has helped the Fairfax County
 Board of Supervisors and the Planning Commission make informed decisions regarding changes in
 traffic capacity due to the completion of the Woodrow Wilson Bridge Project at the Richmond Highway,
 Huntington Avenue, Old Richmond Highway, and Fort Hunt Road intersections; and

WHEREAS, the Mount Vernon Council of Citizens' Associations has also worked to ensure that
 quality transportation networks, mass transit projects, land-use planning, and school enhancements are
 integrated into Fairfax County's long-term planning; and
