4. Title: Hunting license; trip hunting license for residents.

5. Summary: This bill allows Virginia residents to purchase a trip hunting license in lieu of the standard local or statewide hunting license. Current law allows only nonresidents to purchase a trip hunting license.

8. Fiscal Implications: It is anticipated that this bill will result in a nominal fiscal impact for the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries (DGIF), as it is expected to generate new hunting license sales that are not currently captured. DGIF has indicated that the proposed legislation would allow participants to purchase the daily license in lieu of an annual license as an alternative entry point to learning how to hunt.
