3. Committee: General Laws

4. Title: Lottery; disclosure of identity of winners.

5. Summary: Prohibits the Virginia Lottery from disclosing information about individual winners whose prize exceeds \$10 million, and exempts such information from disclosure under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), unless the winner consents to disclosure. Under FOIA, disclosure of the winner's name, hometown, and amount won is currently mandatory.

9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected: Virginia Lottery

10. Technical Amendment Necessary: No.

11. Other Comments: The proposed legislation is similar to Senate Bill 1060-S1 (Spruill), except House Bill 1650-H1 requires the Virginia Lottery to not disclose the personal information of a lottery winner whose lottery prize exceeds \$10 million. Senate Bill 1060-S1 does not have a lottery prize threshold for the disclosure of a lottery prize winner's personal information.
